History of the Organization:

Motherchak Naboday Kishalay Sangha, MNKS in short was founded by a young man Mr. Bijay krishna Raj of Motherchak Village with his young fellows in the year of 1985 to serve his fellow poor people. Agile and educated Mr. Raj with his devotion and commitment to the people and enabled them to cherish their dream of equity and justice. The tribal people who have been deprived for long years needed much developmental intervention. Hence to bring light to the obscure tribal land, MNKS was born. The light was and is for enlightening Dalits as human being who cannot be differed from any other people. MNKS has started reviving it's nod to defuse exploitations on Dalits. Under much disturbed socio-political conditions, the organization maintained its philosophy to help people in hunger and devastation. We the people of MNKS are not change agent; neither we are practitioner of salvation. We are just facilitator of development for the people, by the people of the people. The members of MNKS included many santal youth in rural sports like kabadi, wrestling etc. Enormous talents were found among santal youth which if nurtured properly with guidance and coaching, would help them to come out with flying colours. In gradual context, the organization could set some foot mark in the Endeavour of life enrichment for Dalits. MNKS set up its goal, tapped local govt. and non-govt. resources to find the means of enlightening peoples' lives. The Sangha has started with a dream to help the people who are in need and to ensure equal lives to all. Gradually the members of MNKS understand that they can help not just a community but to the society, finally the organization came into force as a registered organization in 2002. Age considers; youth ventures. After registration the process of participations of people in the target area for development process got roll on in the form of transcendental walk, PRA, need prioritizations, planning of the programme, execution, monitoring and ganging the impact. In the year of 2014 days passed and the organization took another feather in their dream by establishing a Home for Children with Special Need girls under Integrated Child Protection Scheme. Days passed, MNKS working hard since the very first time to help the people in need. Some of its previous activities are Catch the child early , CWSN Home for Homeless girls, Promotion and celebration of cultural events, Reacting unreached with the library service, Awarness campaign to ensure child rights, Swachhata Hi Seva, Organizing annual outdoor and indoor sports events, Skill development training programme for the women SHG, Helping the poor and needy children in their studies.

Activities of the organization

- 1. Early childhood education (Pre-Primary Center) programme in collaboration with Shiva Charity (Bristol, U.K) under 'foreign contribution and regulation act' & it's service delivery system:- Early childhood education(Pre-Primary Center) is the key to betterment of society. Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all, it's important to educate the purely innocent hearts of children and the intervention started 6 years back with three early childhood education centers at Pingla and three at Sabang Block of Paschim Medinipur district. There are 18 trained teachers and one supervisor to look after the whole thing. These Centers are still stepping forward with district output, so far 240 children have gone through this pre-school education system and 98% children are now in the formal schools, continuing their studies with no dropout rates among them. Proudly it's an outstanding move that 80% of these children belong to socially and economically backward families. Tiffin is providing to them. They are under 3 to 6 years old.
- 2. 'Scheme for adolescent girls and kanyashree prakalpa convergence programme', under govt. Of west Bengal & it's service delivery system:—
 The objective of the programme is to empower the adolescent girls to raise their voices and to demand their rights from the duty bearers, help adolescent girls to share their needs and issues, and work collectively to address the same to various government line departments so that they can access the services. This project has started in December, 2019 at Sabang, Pingla, Debra, Kharagpur-1 and Kharagpur Urban block of Paschim Medinipur district. 5 number of Project Co-coordinators and 11 Number of Field Facilitators are engaged to monitor the whole work from the ground level.





3. Multi Services Center for PWD:

The organization has conduct skill training programme on Drawing, Yoga, Music, Education and Dance for the disabled persons. The programme was organized by our organization in collaboration with Lilabati And Phanindranath Day Memorial Trust. It helps to make them independent and self sufficient.





4. <u>Home for children with special need girls, under 'Mission Vatsalya', Govt.</u> of India & its service delivery system -

The organization has been running a CWSN home for girls under Mission Vatsalya.



The CWSN Home was situated in the month of November, 2014. At first it was started with two deaf and dumb residents, Days passed those two became 54, amongst them 32 residents are intellectually disabled, 21 residents are deaf and dumb and the rest one is physically challenged. Our aim is to give proper care and

facilities to the children with special need girls because they also have the right to live like others do. We believe in, to be the reason someone smiles today.

• Staffs under Mission Vatsalya to facilitate facilities to the CWSN girls:

Under the Mission Vatsalya the organization get 1 residential Superintendent, 2 Counselors, 2 Child welfare officer, 4 House mothers, 2 Special educators, 2 Educators, 2 Nurses, 2 Para medical staff, 2 Store keeper cum accountant, 2 House keeper, 4 Cooks, 2 Art & craft& activity Teacher, 2 Care taker cum vocational instructor, 4 Helper cum Night watchman. MNKS have a hard working and dedicated team to work for the development of its children with special need girls. Talent wins games, but teamwork and intelligence win championships.

• Security arrangements:

The organization secures its children from the evil eyes of the society by preparing a proper boundary wall construction. MNKS has a gate keeper and four night guards alternatively to take proper security measurement. 25 CCTV cameras are also installed all over the home premises and boundary walls so that it can prevent any kind of bad situation. Staffs are also directed to monitor CCTV cameras for 24 hours.

5. 'Helping the poor and needy children', in collaboration with Shamdashani Foundation-

This donation is helping us from the very first time to buy specialized equipments like, flash card, Charts, Posters, Maps, Diagrams, Graphs, Photographs, Cartoons, Comic strips, used as teaching learning material for the children with special need.





5. 'Multi Service Center for Disabled Orphan Children' in collaboration with Lilabati and Phanindranath Day Memorial Trust:-

We have been running a Multi Service Center for Disabled Orphan Children' for tribal dropouts with special need children in collaboration with Lilabati and Phanindranath Day Memorial Trust and have been providing service to the backward tribal children with special need in our locality. The crech centre is situated at Gokulpur village under Palshya Gram Panchayat of Kharagpur-II Block in the district of Paschim Medinipur. There are 54 nos. of beneficiary in our Multi Service Center for Disabled Orphan Children' center. We have been trying to make them teaching and learning through non formal way.

Not only that we are also make them teaching and learning about daily life and drawing and dancing and Yoga practice and also soft skill vocational training with the help of Special Educator, Drawing Teacher, Music and Dance teacher, Yoga Teacher ,Vocational instructor. The process of teaching and learning is continued for the development of tribal dropouts with special need. It is possible only for the assistance of Lilabati and Phanindranath Day Memorial Trust.

7. Income generating programmes:

• Duckery project:

The Organization runs a duckery project in its campus for generating income. It's easy to make a standard profit from duck farming. Duck farming is also become a stable employment source. He said many people commercially raise ducks on a small scale to get meat or eggs.

• Fish cultivation:

The organization has its two owned lake in its campus. Fish cultivation is no doubt profitable. This is especially so when we feed at the low end of food chain or when cheap but nutritious ingredients are used in making fish feed.

• Dairy:

Dairy is a universal agricultural production. Milk is produced daily and therefore can provide regular cash income. Milk is a good source of thiamin, riboflavin and vitamin B12. Milk contains small amounts of niacin, pantothenic acid, vitamin B6, vitamin C, and foliate and is not considered a

major source of these vitamins in the diet. Milk contains the fat soluble vitamins A, D, E, and K.

• Horticulture :

The organization has its own land in a huge amount. They cultivate seasonal vegetables by using vermin compost. They engaged local youth to take care of the garden and therefor the agriculture. Local tribal youths are employed as the workers.

Welfare programme

(i) SHG Capacity Building:

The Organization has conducted various capacity building programmes for the development of women, to make them economically independent and self sufficient, that they can help their family to run smoothly and come out from their struggle to lead a healthy life.

(ii) Old age welfare:

The Organization has conducted old age welfare programmes for the development of old age people that they can earn something for their family and to erase the thought that they are burden for their children's family. To minimize the old age problem, organization runs counseling sessions by giving them mental relaxation.

(iii) <u>Help to poor and needy children:</u> The organization helps the poor and needy children by giving them book, notebook, pen, pencil, & eraser that they could read carefully without facing any obstacles and pray for their better future.
