Our judicial area of work accounts for 19% of all live births and 20% of all maternal death. Low level of maternal care service coupled with young mothers giving birth too many children at shorter intervals, further contributes to increase the level of infant and maternal mortality. Only few women receive all the recommended antenatal care to ensure safe delivery of a normal healthy child. Infant mortality rate and mother mortality rate are important health indicators for any community. The health or family planning workers visit very few rural women at home. The infrastructure available at sub centers, primary health centers and community health centers are lagging behind the national norms and are inadequate to serve the population effectively. The survey confirms 68% of PHCs have no operation theatre. 57% of PHCs do not have labor room.73% ANM do not stay at sub centers. These all give birth a child with poor APGAR scores. Child survival may be defined as interval between a life birth and death before reaching his/her 5<sup>th</sup> birthday. This is a crucial period when fast growth in all direction of development takes place. Emphasis has often been laid on delaying the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday, spacing birth, avoiding too many births and promoting child bearing in time to save the life. An appeal to policy planner for appropriate epidemiological understanding of child development through micro level studies for an appropriate child health development.

We do not have good institutional deliveries. The crucial question is to strike a balance between the rate of child birth, the condition of child birth and the rate of their physical development.

In relation of Uttrakhand per capita availability of food grain still remains below nutrition level of 575 Grams per day 48.63% children are undernourished, 81% of population is forced to live with polluted drinking water or contaminated natural water resources with extremely poor sanitation level.

The development of children in a rural family is depending on father's occupation and education is important factors that affect the risk of child development. It is generally observed that child development is best among highly skilled occupational group. It is more probable that socio- economic conditions adverse to the child development exist in the family. Low maternal education, poor housing, low income and limited access to and use of health service. Hence as in the case of mother education, father's occupation has a systematic inverse association.
