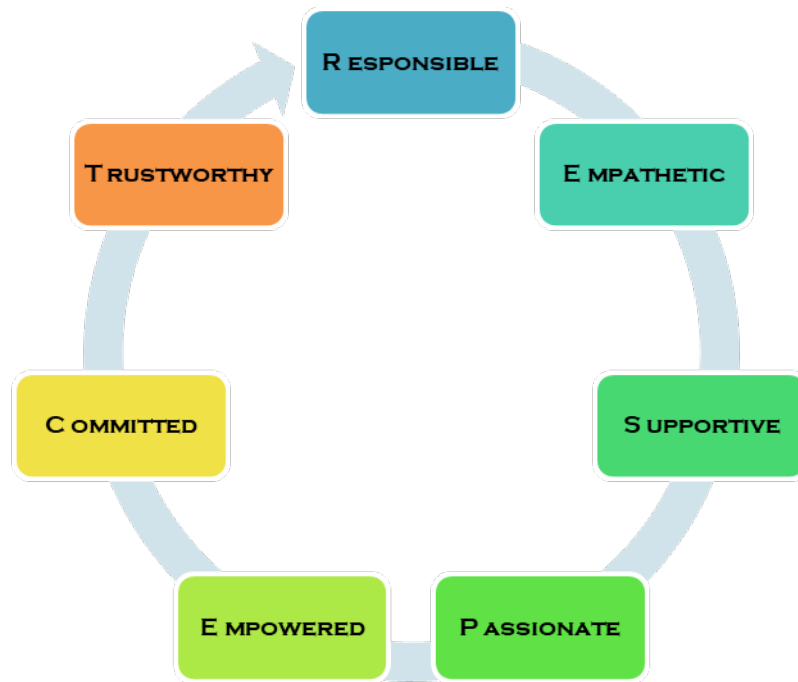

- **Collaboration** – Working together with families and communities to bring lasting change.

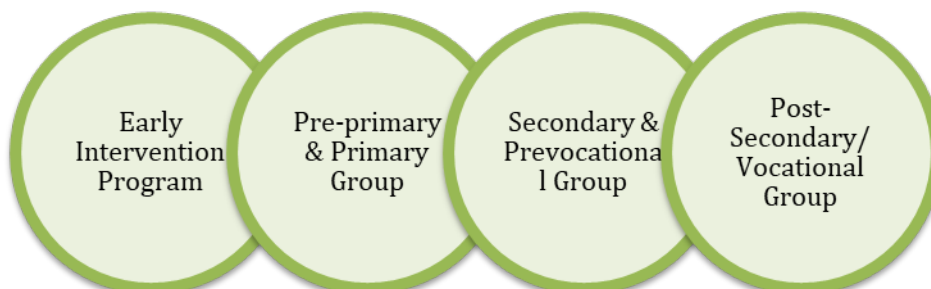


MISSION & VISION

The Bannu Rehabilitation Team brings together a group of qualified and compassionate professionals dedicated to improving the lives of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Our multidisciplinary team includes neuropsychologists, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech and language pathologists, and special educators who work collaboratively to enhance each child’s functional abilities and independence.

Every student receives a comprehensive assessment, followed by an individualized education plan (IEP) designed to address their unique strengths and challenges. Progress is continuously monitored, documented, and shared with parents to ensure sustained improvement.

Guided by the expertise of the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID), our programs integrate evidence-based therapies, research, and family participation — empowering children to gain confidence, develop life skills, and move closer to inclusion in mainstream society.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The **Bannu Early Intervention Program** provides specialized learning and therapeutic support for infants and toddlers from birth to three years of age who show developmental delays or are at risk due to medical conditions. The program focuses on early detection, individualized therapy, and family involvement to promote healthy growth, communication, and functional development during the most critical years of a child's life.

Daily Care and Grouping

Students are grouped according to their abilities and chronological age into various learning levels — **Early Intervention, Pre-primary, Primary, Pre-secondary, Secondary, Pre-vocational, and Vocational/Post-secondary training**. Each student attends school regularly and receives personalized instruction based on their developmental needs.

The **Early Intervention and Primary** programs, designed for children aged 3–12 years, focus on foundational learning and developmental milestones. Recognizing that early childhood is a crucial window for growth, the institute delivers **intensive, evidence-based educational therapies** that strengthen cognitive, behavioral, and social skills. These structured interventions help children build independence, enhance communication, and reduce the impact of developmental challenges.

Educational Model at Bannu NeuroHealth

The educational approach at **Bannu Neuro Health & Rehabilitation Institute** blends structured instruction with emotional and social development. Each student receives personalized attention and evidence-based learning interventions designed to meet their individual goals.

Our program emphasizes:

- **Discrete Trial Instruction:** Three hours of focused, structured learning each day using Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) — a scientifically proven method that supports measurable skill development.
- **Family-Centered Support:** Continuous communication through daily notes, weekly review meetings, and home visits, ensuring families remain active partners in their child's progress.
- **Low Teacher–Student Ratio:** Maintaining smaller class sizes for personalized care, focused teaching, and stronger relationships.
- **Individualized Instruction:** Each child follows a customized curriculum tailored to their abilities, learning style, and therapy goals.

SERVICES OFFERED

To accommodate the diverse schedules of families, Early Intervention services are available in the early morning, late afternoon, evening, and on weekends. Services include:

- Social play groups
- Physical, occupational, and speech therapy
- Sensory integration activities
- Behavior therapy
- Goal and objective development
- Social work support
- Individual and group counseling
- Transition-to-school guidance and support

SCHOOL FACULTY

Bannu began with a small but passionate team of 10 staff members. Within the first year, the team grew to 24, and today we are proud to have **30 full-time professionals** — including **10 special educators certified by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI)** with Bachelor's or Diploma degrees in special education, speech therapy, and vocational rehabilitation.

Our educators are supported by assistant teachers, therapists, and caregivers who work together to create a nurturing, structured, and inclusive learning environment for every child.

CO-CURRICULAR & ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

The academic year 2024–25 witnessed a diverse range of educational, therapeutic, and social engagement activities at Bannu Neuro Health & Rehabilitation Institute.

These included field trips aimed at experiential learning, outreach programs fostering community involvement, and in-house events that celebrated national days, cultural festivals, and awareness occasions.

Each activity was designed to enhance learning, social participation, and the holistic development of our students.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2024–25

- Conducted a Health Camp with Primary Health Center (23 Oct 2024)
- Celebrated major cultural and national festivals including Diwali, Christmas, Sankranti, & Ugadi
- Organized 10+ field trips and 3 major outings for experiential learning
- Hosted visits by doctors from India and abroad (Dr. Cardemo, Dr. Clara, Dr. Praveen Kumar)
- Conducted a comprehensive Eye Check-up with Sharadha Eye Hospital
- Enhanced parent engagement through regular meetings and counseling sessions
- Continued vocational and life skill training programs under NIMH guidance

FIELD TRIPS & OUTINGS

To enhance real-world learning experiences, several educational field visits were organized throughout the year. Students explored various community and industrial locations such as Spencer Supermarket (Adalath, 29.06.2024), Art & Craft Bazaar (Hanamkonda), Kapil Zebra Bakery (Rangampet), Post Office (Hanumakonda), HNK Vegetable Market, Kazipet Railway Station (25.07.2024), Indian Overseas Bank (Mulkanoor, 31.12.2024), HNK Police Station, HNK Bus Stand (30.12.2024), and N.S.P Dairy, Gudepadu (20.01.2025). Students also visited farm lands and vegetable fields (07.04.2024) to gain exposure to agricultural practices.

The Institute continued to engage with the community through outreach and awareness initiatives. Key programs included visits to Siddireddy Kanaka Cheruvu (18.09.2024), Manasa Power (30.11.2024), and Mini Medaram at Atmakur (03.12.2024). Further collaborations included visits from external professionals such as Dr. Praveen Kumar (15.03.2025) and Dr. Clara from America (10.01.2025), providing valuable exposure to global perspectives in healthcare and rehabilitation. Additionally, partnerships were established with Sankalith Eye Hospital (23.03.2025) to organize eye health check-up camps for students.

EVENTS & CELEBRATIONS

Festivals and national days were celebrated with enthusiasm and inclusivity. Key events included Independence Day, Raksha Bandhan, Sri Krishna Ashtami, Teachers' Day, Vinayaka Chavithi, Dussehra, Diwali, Christmas, Sankranti, Republic Day, Holi, and Ugadi. Students actively participated in cultural programs, music, and dance activities that nurtured confidence and teamwork.

EDUCATIONAL & THERAPEUTIC PROGRAMS

Our curriculum integrates individualized education plans (IEPs), speech therapy, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, sensory integration, behavioral therapy, and vocational training. Each child's progress is tracked regularly and reviewed in coordination with NIEPID guidelines. We continue to maintain a low student-teacher ratio to ensure personalized attention and development.

VOCATIONAL & LIVELIHOOD TRAINING

Under the Bannu Garments Tailoring Unit, 25 mothers and 5 adults with intellectual disabilities were trained and employed. Over 10,000 school uniforms were stitched and distributed. Vegetable farming, folding the clothes, Phenyl making, candle making, painting, crafts etc are all thought as part of this training.

BANNU CHARITABLE HOSPITAL – Eturnagaram Mulugu (Since 2016):



Tucked away in the forested belt of Eturnagaram, **Bannu Charitable Hospital** has been a lifeline for thousands of families who once had to travel long distances for even the simplest medical care. Since its humble beginning in **2016**, the hospital has stood with the people of this remote tribal region — offering healing, hope, and human touch where healthcare was once a distant dream.

With just **16 beds**, a modest **operation theatre**, a small but efficient **diagnostic lab**, **ultrasound and X-ray facilities**, and an ever-active **ambulance service**, the hospital runs with remarkable dedication. A team of **two full-time doctors**, **twelve committed staff members**, and **six visiting specialists** in **orthopedics, pediatrics, gynecology & infertility, and eye care** form the backbone of its services. Together, they ensure that no one is denied treatment because of distance or poverty.

KEY SERVICES:

- 24/7 Outpatient & Emergency Services
- Operation Theatre for minor and major procedures
- Diagnostic Laboratory and Radiology (Ultrasound & X-ray)
- Inpatient facilities for general and maternity care
- Pharmacy and Ambulance Services
- Visiting Specialist Consultations from other hospitals weekly once – Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Gynecology & Infertility, Ophthalmology, and General Medicine

Every day at Bannu Charitable Hospital begins with the same purpose — to make quality healthcare accessible and affordable. From treating emergency cases and performing safe deliveries to managing chronic conditions and offering preventive care, the hospital has become a trusted name in the region.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Regular medical camps and preventive health awareness sessions were conducted across tribal hamlets, ensuring early detection and timely management of health conditions. The ambulance and field support teams played a crucial role in reaching patients in remote locations.

FUTURE VISION

To expand into a 50-bed multispecialty hospital offering comprehensive healthcare under one roof. Planned areas of growth include maternal and child health, non-communicable disease management, trauma care, and telemedicine support for rural patients.

IMPACT STATEMENT

Bannu Charitable Hospital continues to stand as a symbol of compassion and service, bridging the gap between healthcare and humanity. Through dedicated effort, the team remains committed to the belief that *“Every life deserves care.”*





AROGYA SARATHI FREE CANCER SCREENING BUS (since 2021)



OVERVIEW:

The *Arogya Sarathi Free Cancer Screening Bus* was launched with a mission to promote **early detection and awareness of cancer**, ensuring that people in rural and underserved communities gain access to preventive healthcare. Built on the belief that “*Cancer detected early is curable*,” this initiative aims to save lives through screening, education, and timely referral for further care.

FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT:

The mobile screening bus is a **state-of-the-art diagnostic and awareness unit**, equipped with:

- Digital X-Ray and Mammography Units
- Pap Smear Testing and Pathology Lab Cabins
- Capacity to perform over **200 scans** and **300 blood tests per day**
- Waterproof tents and detachable poles for private Pap Smear testing
- Dedicated air-conditioning for each cabin
- UPS power backup and generator system
- 58” LED display and public address system for educational videos and announcements

BACKGROUND

The *Arogya Sarathi* bus was **donated by KNR Constructions Ltd.** as part of their **CSR initiative** and was **inaugurated on November 18, 2022**, by *Hon'ble IT Minister Sri K. T. Rama Rao* at *Pragathi Bhavan, Hyderabad*.

Since then, the project has been **independently operated and managed by Bannu Arogyada Seva Society**, reaching thousands of beneficiaries through regular screening and awareness programs.

IMPACT SUMMARY (SINCE INCEPTION)

- **75,000+** individuals screened across Telangana
- **Hundreds of suspected cases** identified and referred for further evaluation
- **Extensive awareness programs** conducted on preventive healthcare, women's health, and lifestyle modification

KEY HIGHLIGHTS (2024–25):

During the year, **10 cancer screening and awareness camps** were organized in collaboration with local government bodies and institutions at locations including:

- Raj Bhavan, Hyderabad
- Greater Warangal Municipal Corporation (GWMC)
- District Collector Office, Hanumakonda
- Dammanapeta and nearby rural areas

A total of **2,500 women** were screened for **breast, cervical, and oral cancers**. Free basic medications were distributed, and those with **positive or suspicious results** were **referred to higher medical centers** for further evaluation and management.

FUTURE VISION:

Moving forward, *Arogya Sarathi* aims to expand its reach to **remote tribal and rural regions** of **Mulugu, Bhupalpally, and Warangal**, screening an additional **3,000 individuals** in the coming year. The project also plans to adopt **digital reporting and follow-up systems** to strengthen continuity of care and early intervention.

IMPACT STATEMENT:

Through *Arogya Sarathi*, Bannu Arogyadha Seva Society continues to bring **awareness, early detection, and preventive health services** directly to the people — ensuring that every life has a chance at timely care and a healthier future.



KASTHURBA GANDHI SEVA GRAM- (since 2022)



OVERVIEW

In February 2022, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between MGM Hospital, Warangal, represented through the District Collector, and Bannu Arogyadha Seva Society for the management and upkeep of Kasthurba Gandhi Seva Gram. The facility was envisioned as a temporary accommodation center for attendants and families of patients admitted to the MGM and Kakatiya Medical College (KMC) Government Hospitals.

Upon taking over the facility, Bannu Arogyadha Seva Society initiated a **comprehensive renovation and beautification project**, investing **₹40 Lakhs (Rupees Forty Lakhs only)** to transform the premises into a clean, safe, and dignified space for patient families. We received appreciation certificate from Govt of Telangana on the occasion of Republic Day.

INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS

- Development of complete greenery and landscaping
- Repair and waterproofing of sheds and structures
- Renovation of washrooms and restoration of water tanks
- Painting of the entire campus
- Vastu corrections and layout improvements
- Construction of a new drainage system
- Creation of a dedicated storage area
- Furnishing of rooms to ensure comfort for families in need

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

The Sevagram now features **22 renovated rooms** and **2 dormitories**, along with a **community cooking area** and clean sanitation facilities. Accommodation is offered at **nominal rates ranging from ₹25 to ₹125 per day**, ensuring affordability for families who often travel long distances to accompany their loved ones for medical treatment.

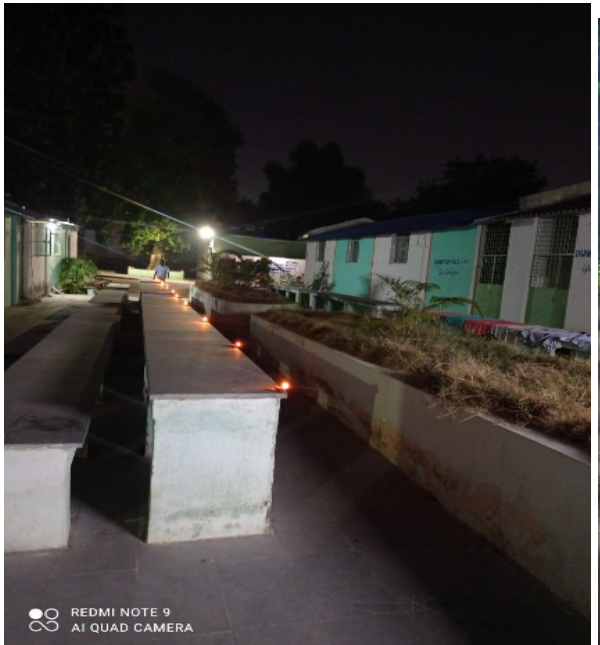

By offering safe lodging and basic amenities at minimal cost, the initiative directly supports **hundreds of patient families every month**, aligning with Bannu Arogyadha Seva Society's mission of **“Seva through Compassion.”**





Bannu KG Sevagram provided me shelter - a testimony of a Govt hospital patient attendee:
 My name is Kavitha(name changed). I am from Vasantapoor. My Grandfather was admitted in the MGM Hospital after he met with an accident and sustained head injury. Post surgery, he was admitted to the ICU ward. The doctor advised us to find accommodation nearby. We tried a lot the hospital but we failed because we could not afford them. Traveling between home and hospital was also not possible. When we inquired, our doctor suggested we check the Kasturba Sevagram. We visited the Sevagram and registered immediately. The room is very spacious, clean and well ventilated. It was a relief to know that the price of a single room with attached bathroom per day was Rs.125/- (1.5\$). The management is very friendly and supportive. They allowed us to cook in the room. We go to the hospital on a walk. We feel comfortable at the sevagram. We thank Bannu Arogyada Seva Society and the Kasturba Sevagram for helping us in our tough times and for supporting us throughout.

When we checked in the city, accommodation was very costly and we couldn't afford them. We came across a flyer on the hospital notice board regarding Kasturba Sevagram. We immediately checked in and were relieved that the price was just Rs. 75 (1\$) per day. The room was also spacious, clean and well ventilated. The corridor, garden and the premises were well maintained. The staff was also very helpful and supportive. We cook in the room and walk to the hospital everyday. Both the mother and baby are safe now. Our doctor informed us that the baby has to be under observation in the incubator for another week. NAYI KIRAN – A DRUG DEADDICTION & DETOXIFICATION REHABILITATION PROGRAMME (since 2022)



OVERVIEW

Launched in 2022 in **collaboration with the Warangal Police Department**, *Nayi Kiran* is a compassionate initiative aimed at addressing the growing concern of substance abuse among youth, particularly **“Ganja-addicted children” under the age of 20**. The program’s core objective is to **provide structured rehabilitation, medical detoxification, and psychosocial support**, enabling young individuals to break free from addiction and rebuild their lives with dignity.

PROGRAMME APPROACH

The *Nayi Kiran* model combines medical care, counseling, and behavioral therapy with family and community participation to ensure sustainable recovery. Each camp is designed to create a supportive, disciplined, and nurturing environment that helps participants overcome physical dependence while restoring their emotional and social well-being.

KEY FEATURES

- Comprehensive medical detoxification under professional supervision
- Psychological counseling and behavioral therapy sessions
- Yoga, meditation, and group activities for mental balance
- Life skills and motivational sessions to support reintegration
- Parental counseling and follow-up support post rehabilitation
- Close coordination with law enforcement and social welfare departments

IMPACT SUMMARY (SINCE INCEPTION)

- 3 successful rehabilitation camps conducted
- 150+ beneficiaries in each camp (total over 450 youth)
- Over 85% participants reported sustained abstinence after follow-up
- Families and schools reconnected with youth through structured reintegration efforts

KEY HIGHLIGHTS (2024–25)

The third season of *Nayi Kiran* was organized during 2024–25, focusing on a **holistic 30-day detox and rehabilitation program**. Activities included health checkups, counseling, and awareness sessions on drug prevention for both participants and parents.

FUTURE VISION

Bannu Arogyadha Seva Society aims to expand *Nayi Kiran* into a **continuous rehabilitation and skill development center** offering vocational training and long-term psychosocial support for reformed youth. Plans are also in place to establish **school-based awareness campaigns** to prevent early-stage drug use among adolescents.

IMPACT STATEMENT

Nayi Kiran continues to serve as a **ray of hope** for young lives once trapped in addiction — transforming vulnerability into strength and despair into new beginnings.
