JAGRUTI-II:

In our culture and tradition, women have great social & human values but there is a serious failing in our society i.e. undue importance to the male members contemporarily resulting to neglect the women and tending the way for neglect, exploitation, violence, discrimination. The female members of the society ultimately feel inferior and suffered a lot and also awaiting the misfortune life so on. Thus, the results of such inferior attitude towards women have paved the path for distress & tortured by their near and dear, even supposing to becoming a homeless. Neither from their parental house nor from spouse have get support to live with dignity.

Humanitarian point of view the Women & Child Development, Department Govt. of Odisha was made a survey and found to know there are many homeless and distressed women seeking immediate care and support. Keeping in view the Women and Child Development department introduced 'JAGRUTI-II' model for providing shelter, care and rehabilitation to the scores of women living in difficult circumstance. Though the NGOs & local Govt. agencies has a great knowledge and reach in the area specific the Department wants to operate such scheme 'JAGRUTI-II' with the help of NGOs & Govt. local bodies. Our organization has been running the said scheme by the name of "JAGRUTI-II" in Kendrapara district of Odisha from 2023-24 at Madana under Garadpur block of Kendrapara district of the costal Odisha.

The "Jagruti-II" is accommodating 50 helpless women living in difficult circumstances. The inmates are being provided integrated services such as lodging, boarding, healthcare, clothing, recreational, legal & emotional counseling and legal assistance along with skill training for their complete rehabilitation. There is also provision of providing shelter to the dependent children of the inmates up to the age of 12yrs in case of boys and 18yrs in case of girls. The children are being provided with all basic facilities along with study materials for primary education.

Similarly, our organization has also been functioning another **JAGRUTI-II** in Koraput district from 2023-24. This project is located at Mahavir Nagar of district head quarter of Koraput, Odisha. Similar facilities like above are also being offered to 50 Nos. of women belonging from difficult circumstances.

MAINTAINANCE OF HOMES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS: NATIONAL ACTION PLAN FOR SENIOR CITIZENS (NAPSr.C):

Our rich culture joint family which has inherited to us the great social and family values that exist among the various members of the family. By and large dragging on to the western culture our traditional conservative system of our society is warped. The immediate result is breaking down of joint families into nuclear families and advocating independent living. As a result the emotional bonding that existed among the members of the families are breaking down. In the other hand the youths are migrating to urban locations with their families and trying to settled down there permanently as a result they compel to deserting their elders at their ancestral home. Many older people getting homeless and tortured by their near & dear.

Snatching the situation Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India has to identify the critical problems associated with these neglected sections of the society & have promoting a scheme called "An Integrated Program for Senior citizens" under which various welfare activities are being taken in to consideration for promoting holistic care & support to the older persons in distress. Under the scheme, our organization has been managing an "Senior citizen Home" in one of the remote pocket of tribal district Koraput. It is being run at Tusuba under Lamtaput block of Koraput district of Odisha and providing shelter to 25 nos. of deserving neglected older persons since 2001-2002. The home is providing need based integrated support & care services like lodging, boarding, healthcare, recreational facilities and also assistance for production based activities and mass awareness programme for the community. To educate the people about ill treatment and how to advocate for better services to the older persons.

The said initiative of Govt. of India has been providing integrated rehabilitation services to the scores of helpless & distressed elders who are neglected, deserted and engaged in hard works and even not able to get required food and care.

AROGYA PLUS PROGRAMME:

Our government has the mandate of providing primary healthcare services in the rural areas and to fulfill its objective it is taking the assistance of both Govt. & Non Govt. institutions for providing healthcare service in the un-served and underserved areas of the state of Odisha. Arogya Plus is one of the schemes under National Health Mission (NHM), Govt of India as well as Govt. of Odisha. It is being implemented in extreme affected area of the state where the healthcare service is very miserable. Under this project A Mobile Health Unit is under operation and providing primary healthcare services in underserved & un-served pockets of the tribal area.





Our organization managed this project in Mattamput, Dhadi, Unkadeli, Jalahanjar, Badigada, Dabuguda and chikenput Sub Center under Lamtaput block of Koraput district which is remote and a cut off area due to the presence of Kolab reservoir. This project was started from 1st June'2016 and provided services in 67 nos. of villages covering to above Sub Centers along with other disease treatment points like Schools and other community centers. There is also a Mobile Health Unit (MHU) provided emergency health care & services during epidemics, accidents, other national health programmes organized as and when required.

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NATIONAL ACTION PLAN FOR DRUG DEMAND REDUCTION(NAPDDR) INTEGRATED RERHABILITATION CENTER FOR ADDICTS (IRCA):

In prehistoric civilization the people in our society have used drug in various forms and manner for therapeutic purposes. Some were taking for sake of curiosity or temporary pleaser and also for the sake of temporary pleasure. They use the drugs for purposes of other than medical thus abusing it. Such drug abuse has its serious repercussions for the body as well as for the others associated with them. The drug abuse inflicts irreparable loss to the physical and psychological conditions of the human being leading to serious health disorders, and hampering social disharmony and law & order situation. Many families faced Sevier financial down to drawn and lose bonding among the members.



(A view of Project Coordinator interaction with inspection team IRCA at Lamtaput) Keeping in view of the situation, the Govt. of India has been managing a scheme "Scheme for National Action plan for drug demand reduction (NAPDDR) " which envisages to providing educative, preventive as well as curative services to those affected by drug abuse. Under the said scheme our organisation has been running a 15 Bedded Integrated Rehabilitation Center for Addicts (IRCA) at Lamtaput under Koraput district of Odisha since 2001-02.

The said center has been providing various services like free Lodging, boarding, fooding, and medicine, including awareness generation against drug abuse, identification of addicts, motivation and counseling for treatment within the house and outside also. The addicts are provided services like detoxification, counseling and rehabilitation and outreach services etc. though it is very difficult to deal with the clients who are living in un healthy & unreachable areas of the district, after proper care & services the clients were recovered changing their chief Executive of the mind set for maintaining a sober life and re-integrate with the main stream of the society. There were 180 nos. of addicted people have been treated during the year and most of them are now maintaining drug free and joyful life.

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STATE SUPPORT CENTRE:

Women in India are facing different types of gender-based violence. Violence against women in India refer to physical or sexual violence committed against a woman, typically by a man. Common forms of violence against women in India include acts such as domestic abuse, sexual assault, acid attack, murder etc.

To address the problems of these women who are affected by gender-based violence, the Women & Child development, Department Govt. of Odisha have introduced a scheme named "STATE SUPPORT CENTRE, which intend to support women affected by violence, in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at the workplace. Women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse, irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture will be facilitated with support and redressal in these centres.

Keeping in view the safety and security of women in India, our organisation GITA with the support of Women and Child Development, Department Govt. of Odisha has started a STATE SUPPORT CENTRE at our Dist. Headquarters – Kendrapara. from 2023-24, our centre is providing 24*7 service to the affected women.

We have been spreading the about the centre widely in our district and will continue to do so with the help of banners, hoardings and word of mouth so that it can reach to every woman and they come forward to us whenever they are affected by gender-based violence. We are also carrying out several meetings and awareness programme with the Anganwadi, ASHA's and Block level functionaries.

During this year, 254 women victims were registered in our centre and out of them 140 cases have been solved or compromised after counseling and legal initiative. We are hopeful that the "STATE SUPPORT CENTRE" will help more and more victims in the upcoming years and help eradicate gender-based violence from the society.

MAA GRUHA:

A Maternity Waiting Home (MWH) is a short stay home residential treatment facility located near the delivery point where 'high risk' pregnant women can wait for delivery. It is an effective means to 'bridge the geographical gap' and superstition. By the means of operation, "Maa Gruha" provides limited accommodation with food to the expecting mothers and attendants. Medical care is also provided round the clock with provision of referral facility to the delivering hospital. It is generally run in partnership mode in vulnerable areas with low institutional deliveries. Though there are no concrete community trials suggesting the effectiveness of such an initiative, opportunities can be utilized for further improvement of the Maa Gruha. The functioning of the Maternity

Waiting Homes can also provide evidences. Minimization of IMR (Infant Mortality Rate) & MMR (Mother Mortality Rate) are two most important activities of National Health Mission (NHM). To fulfill these objectives, we taking the assistance from NHM, Govt. of Odisha for providing health care services in the un-served and underserved areas of utmost remote tribal district of Odisha.

Our organization has gotten an opportunity to managing MAA GRUHA at Baipariguda in October 2013. On the eve of the success another two Maa Gruha began to run at Patangi on 01.04.2016 and Kunduli of Similiguda block on 24.10.2016. which is most backward and inaccessible area of tribal district Koraput of Odisha. During this year 772 nos. of pregnant women have been provided services like proper lodging, boarding, healthcare, counseling and referral to the nearest hospital for delivery during their stay at the centre. The trained of institutional delivery is gradually increasing day by day as a result the rate of IMMR and MMR is decreased accordingly.

Gandhian Advancement

JAGRUTI-I:

Trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation is an organized crime that violates basic human rights. India has emerged as a source, destination and transit for both in-country and cross border trafficking. The problem of trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation is especially challenging due to its myriad complexities and variation. Poverty, low status of women, lack of a protective environment etc. are some of the causes for trafficking. At this moment Trafficking is very common and rampant in almost all the areas of the state. The process of transportation of women and girls by deception, threat, and force with or without the consent to outside of their domicile state



or country for exploitation is termed Women trafficking. In most of the cases the poor women & girls hailing from the rural areas are suffering a lot since they are being traffic out of the family by the opportunistic

middle men to distant locations inside India with assurance of marriage or employment. Once they got out, they are exploited physically and mentally and are also engaged in antisocial activities. Particularly in Koraput district, there were several cases comes to the light who were victimized by so called ill interested people.

The activities under the prevention component are for areas, which are vulnerable to trafficking of women and children. Keeping the view Women and Child Development Department, Govt. of Odisha introduced the scheme "Jagruti-I", rehabilitation and repatriation of women victims of trafficking along with creating general awareness among the public. Under this scheme our organization has been managing "Jagruti-I" a Protective & Rehabilitative Home for the victims of trafficking at Janiguda of district headquarter Koraput from 2023-24.

There are 50 nos. of trafficking victims rescued by our social workers and have provided residential rehabilitation services at the moment which includes lodging, boarding, healthcare, recreational services, psychological emotional counseling. Vocational training has also been provided to the inmates.

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PAPER PLATE & CUP PRODUCTION UNIT:

Besides prime occupation like agriculture and wage labour the women belongs to poor and to poor and Below Poverty Line (BPL) family encouraged to spent their leisure time for an additional income. In the other hand a huge gap in between demand and supply of banana leaves occurs a sevier problem in several occasion in the village of the area.

Addressing the issues our organization has started a paper plate & cup production unit from its own source since last three year. The products are widely used and there is a huge demand of the products in the market. Now 25 Nos. of women are engaged in this production unit and earning Rs.300.00 to Rs.400.00 daily despite their prime occupation. Now they are supporting their family and improve their financial condition to earlier. Besides their prime work schedule, they are able to supplement their day to day expenses as well as expenses for their child education and health. In other hand the unit has been able to meet the demand of rural market as the banana leaves not fulfilled the enormous demand.

FOOD PROCESSING CENTER:

The heart of the rural economy is mainly depending upon agriculture. Near about 75% of the total family are belongs to farmer. Though the majority group of the rural population is weekend by tendering losses in order to sold out the surplus and damage due to inappropriate preservation. They do not have get the real price of the sold out and also loses to chalk out a living, but due to the lack of food processing and preservation technique nearly 20% to 30% of the total food grains, fruits, vegetables etc. produced are wasted. Despite all of their hard work the poor farmers were not getting the real value of their effort. Therefore the rural economy ultimately breaks down as a result our young generations prefer to quit agriculture and engaged to work in hazardous profession. To cope up the situation and prevent these losses, it has been decided to run a training cum production center at village Madana of Kendrapara district with its own sources. The women hailing from poor and marginal farmer's family have been involved in this training program. During the year 25 women from Kendrapara district were trained in food processing & preservation technique which included processing of Grams, food grains, fruits, vegetables and preservation technique of different types of cakes, pickles, spices etc. By utilizing this knowledge they are able to managing the seasonal fruits and vegetables grown in the rural areas for their maximum benefit. It is also found that other farmers from nearby villages were have followed the technique and have become economically self sufficient by starting their own production centre and marketing.


SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR DISABLED:

The Govt. of India, 'Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment' 'Department of Persons with Disabilities' have been taking various steps to help and empower the persons with disabilities. They have been putting all their efforts to turn their disability into ability or from disabled to specially abled, which will help them to lead a respectable life in the society.

To help the specially abled people, our organization "GITA" has started "Special School for Disabled" in the year 2016 at Madana in Kendrapara district. The school is well equipped with all study materials along with sports, games and various fun games & equipment. It also has a state-of-the-art library with 500 useful books which are used regularly by the specially

The facility of separate hostels for both boys and girls are something that has been the cynosure of everyone's eyes. There are various types of services & Supports providing to different category of

abled children.

PwD students like Mental Retardation, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple disability etc. to participate in Society and Community life.

We have teachers who have got special training in teaching these kids and we make sure that they are not just a teacher but also a friend to the students. During this short stint, our organization has gained a widespread appreciation from everyone in the district for its state-of-the-art facilities and hope will continue to do so in the coming year.

PRI MEMBERS TRAINING (Gender Sensitive- GPDP):

Taking Consideration of our Infra structure and experience, SIRD has selected our Organisation for Training Centre for newly elected PRI members since 2019-20. During the financial year 2023-24 our organisation has conducted 2 batches of Training Programme for Ward members of Garadpur Block of Kendrapara District. The trainees as well as the Monitoring officials were satisfied with the facilities provided by our organisation.

PROMOTION FOR SUSTAINABE AGRICULTURE:

In current scenario our rural economy is influencing the GDP of our country as well as state where 75 more percentage of the total households so called farmers is depends upon agriculture & allied activities. Though the lively hood status of our farmer's is so miserable that most of them living with identity of below poverty line so called BPL. There are so many reason can be attribute to the low production, which is again dependent upon the factors like irregular rain fall, absence of adequate irrigation facilities, use of traditional method of cultivation, occurrence of natural calamities etc.

Keeping in view of the problem and improving the source of income of the farmers, a sustainable agriculture practice is to be promoted by our organization through upgrading skill of farmers, Knowledge sharing and adopting new technique as well as new machineries. We organized Training Programme in Sustainable agriculture at Madana under Garadpur block

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of Kendrapara district which included Organic Farming, Use of Bio-fertilizers, Good Agricultural Practice, Integrated Pest management, Soil testing, Micro Irrigation, Use of high yielding varieties of seeds adoption of advanced technology etc with the help of Agriculture department. Most of the farmers have applied the technology in direct consultation with the agriculture experts and have got more benefit than earlier. As a result the farmers were also raising their steps to fight against poverty, malnutrition and health hazards and illiteracy.

DISTRICT DISABILITY REHABLITATION CENTRE (DDRC):

DDRC Kendrapara Managed by our organisation was inaugurated on 07.03.2024 in presence of Local MLA, Collector, ADM, DSSO and other District level officers of Kendrapara Districts. The project aims to provide comprehensive service to the persons with Disabilities at the Grass Root level through creation of infrastructure and capacity building at the district level for Awareness generation, Rehabilitation, Training, Guiding the Grassroot level functionaries. The programme has group of Rehabilitation professional for providing service like Identification, Awareness Generation and early detection and intervention through follow up, Repair of assistive devices, physiotherapy, Speech therapy facilitation of disability certificate, Bus pass and other facilities for the beneficiaries.

The District Disability Rehabilitation Centre has conducted the activities like PwD identification camp at different blocks and provided disability certificates, aids and appliances, artificial limbs and another support services to different category of PwD like Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation, Autism, Multiple disability etc.





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URBAN HEALTH AND WELLNESS CENTER, KOTPAD:

Kotpad NAC of Koraput District is rapidly expanding as a result of which number of slums have increased to a large extend. The slums are malaria prone and other ailments like Typhoid, Mal Nutrition, Respiratory disease continue to plaque the slums community throughout the year.

To address all these health problems, our organisation has taken the operation and management of UHWC, Programme in Kotpad NAC of Koraput district under PPP mode of NHM. The aim of the programme is to address the health care urban poor. To ensure ANC/PNC, achieve 100% Immunization, promotion of institutional Delivery increase 100% use of contraceptive etc. Our organisation actively participated in the programme during the year 2023-24 as a result of which the health condition of the targeted area has developed to a large extend. The slums dwellers are very much satisfied by our service provided to the people.

PISCICULTURE:

Taking into the possibilities and availability of huge quantity of water bodies in the area our or4ganization has given utmost priority to promote Pisciculture to improve the economic condition of the organization as well as the people of the locality. We intervene pisciculture in local 2 ponds at Jagannathpur under Garadpur block of Kendrapara district. There are 11 nos. of poor households have got experience in the field of fishery. The people learnt about the new methodology and alternate fishing like seedling in phase wise. The people able to avoid losses incurred due to over flowing and flood. In addition to the income they have, the people get the benefit of self-consuming as a nutritious food. Our organization is also providing seeds, feeds and pests to other fishing farmers as and when required and also aware through skill upgrading training programme.

CONCLUSION:
