The Managing Committee of the Grama Jyothi National Institute for the Differently Abled has great pleasure in presenting the 16th Annual Report.

BRIEF HISTORY

A small group of friends with the support and encouragement of His Lordship Rt. Rev. Dr. Geevarghese Mar Theodosius Episcopa (then Diocesan Bishop, Thiruvananthapuram-Kollam Diocese of the Mar Thoma Church) formed a charitable society for serving "the least of these brethren". Grama Jyothi National Institute for The Differently Abled (Registration No T.3117 /2004) was registered on 3rd. November, 2004 under the Travancore-Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Act 1955. 'Grama Jyothi Special School', the major activity of the Society commenced functioning at Nalanchira in a rented building with two students on 2nd June 2005. The initial expenses of the Society were met with the amount donated by Mrs. Anamika Thomas and Mr. Thomas Mammen in memory of their late parents Mr. Ajoy Kumar Ghose & Mrs. Sushila Rudra and Mr. & Mrs. C.C. Mammen, Charivukalayil, Kumbanad.

A campus of our own, a long standing dream was realized when a plot of land (125 cents) with a partially completed building was purchased at Kaviyottumugai, Nedumangad in May 2014. The renovated as well as the newly constructed block was dedicated by Rt. Rev. Thomas Mar Timotheos Episcopa on 16th May 2015. The school which functioned at Nalanchira started functioning at the new campus from 4th January 2016 after completing the requisite formalities. It is God's abundant grace and the generous contribution from friends and well-wishers that made our dream a reality.

In pursuance of our motto, "LOVE LIGHTS LIFE" the society aims to provide necessary support and help to 'The Differently Abled' enabling them to manage their life independently to the maximum extent possible. With love, care and proper training, the physically and mentally challenged as well as their families are helped to change their own mindset, parents are empowered to manage the children with special needs and find acceptance in the community.

The general body appointed M/s Thomas Jacob & Co. as the auditors for the year 2019-2020.

FINANCE

Grama Jyothi Special School is a faith venture. Generous donations from friends and well-wishers are the major source to meet the various expenses of this institution. As the expenses are going up, an amount of Rs.4500/- month (Rs.2500/- for educational expenses and Rs.2000/- for transportation expenses) is required to meet the expenses of a student. GOVERNMENT GRANT

This year also our school received grant from the government under the grant for Special Schools through DPI, which helped us to meet a portion of our expenditure

THE GRAMA JYOTHI SPECIAL SCHOOL

The school re-opened for the academic year 2019-2020 on 6th June 2019 and closed in advance for summer vacation on 06.03.2020 due to COVID-19. There were 74 students on our rolls but average attendance is 50. Food, coaching and transportation to all students were provided by the school.

STAFF

The daily affairs of the school were managed by a Principal, 6 specially trained teachers, 3 Care givers, Physiotherapist, Speech Therapist, Accountant, Clerk-cum-Computer Operator, 2 Drivers and 1 Cook. We are grateful to God Almighty for providing us with a team of dedicated staff. We appreciate their sincerity, commitment and hard work for maintaining the school at a high standard. Regular staff meetings were held and counselling sessions by experts were provided to equip the staff.

COACHING

Special curriculum as prescribed by the Director of Public Instruction, Government of Kerala is followed in our school. Students were divided into the following groups based on their age and ability; Care Group, Pre-Primary (two divisions), Primary (two divisions), Secondary, Pre-Vocational and Vocational. We were able to maintain a student-teacher ratio of 1:8 in each class.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

The children who came under the vocational group were given training for making candles, greeting cards, book marks, paper bags, paper pen, medicine cover, photo frames, disinfectant, toilet & washing soaps, paper and fabric flowers, vases, ornaments, fabric painting, weaving mats & bags, jewellery box, wall hanger, hair bow, quilling art & craft etc. The items made by them were exhibited on special occasions.

BAND TROUPE

As part of identifying and developing special skills inherent in our students a Band troupe was started. Students were given training to play instruments like Trumpet, Symbol, Side Drum and Band. It is encouraging to see that many have learned to play the instruments quite well within a short span of time.




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CULTURAL PROGRAMES - SPORTS AND GAMES

The Special School Kalolsavam was held at SMV School, Thiruvananthapuram on 11.10.2019 and our students participated in this event. Annual Sports and Games Meet was held at our campus on 29.11.2019. Sri. Shafeek, Associate Professor, Physical Education Department, Govt. Arts College, Nedumangad took the Salute during the March Past and inaugurated the event. Colourful bunting, hard work by the staff, encouragement from the parents and enthusiastic participation by all the students made the day a memorable one.

WELFARE PROGRAMME

Few needy students were provided with uniforms and learning materials. Financial support for medical purpose was also extended to some.

PHYSIOTHERAPY

Physically challenged students were given physiotherapy sessions on all working days by our full time Physiotherapist Ms. Thasni S. Salim. Considerable improvements were made by these children who could be assessed by their performances on stage, at the various functions held during the year.

SPEECH THERAPY CLINIC

Students with speech disability were given special training by the Speech Therapy students, from the Mar Thoma College of Special Education - Institute of Speech and Hearing (MCSE-ISH), Kasaragod. Remarkable improvement was observed in the students who attended these sessions. We are grateful to MCSE-ISH for including our school as a center for providing internship to their graduates.

NOON MEAL

Lunch was provided to the students on all working days. The daily menu included rice, curry, thoran & aviyal (vegetables). Additionally they were given milk (twice a week), egg (once a week) and meat & fish (once a month). The aid received from the Education Department, Govt. of Kerala under the Noon Meal Scheme has been a great help in this regard. As in the previous years, special food sponsored by well-wishers to commemorate special events in their life were served to the students. The affairs of the Noon Meal scheme are managed by a committee comprising of 6 members including 3 representatives of the parents who ensure that quality food is served under hygienic conditions. We are thankful to the sponsors of special food and the parents and friends who contributed in kind for the noon meal scheme.

TRANSPORTATION

The students are provided transportation from their home to the school and back, utilizing the service of two Tempo Travellers and a Maruti Omni Van.



P. T. A. MEETINGS & COUNSELLING

PTA committee, comprising of 5 members manage the affairs of the PTA. This year 4 PTA meetings were held besides the public gatherings at Onam, Founders day, Christmas. These sessions provided an opportunity for healthy interaction between the parents, teachers and management resulting in the best positive growth and development of each student. Counselling sessions by the following experts, (1) Sri. Panicker M. Jacob, Gandhipuram (2) Smt. Shalley Elizabeth John, Kowdiar, were arranged on these occasions.

STAFF MEETINGS

Staff meetings with the management under the School Resource Programme were held every month for the better functioning of the school.

PICNIC, STUDY & EXPOSURE TOURS

Picnics for students were arranged to the Vizhinjam Harbor, Sagarika Marine Aquarium, Trivandrum Zoo & Kottor Elephant Rehabilitation Centre.

CHRISTMAS CARDS

As in previous years, 10 cards were selected from the many cards made by our students with the help of their teachers and printed for distribution this year also. The inaugural function was held at St. Thomas Residential School on 16.10.2019. Sri. Mathew George, Treasurer, MTCES inaugurated the distribution of the cards by handing over a packet each to the Principal of STHSS and Vice Principal of STRS. A short variety entertainment was presented by our students which drew appreciation from all who attended it. We received tremendous support and encouragement in this endeavor from the following Schools, Parishes and Institutions.

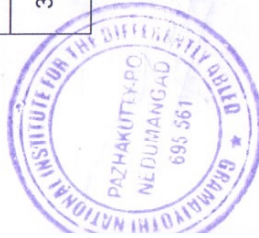

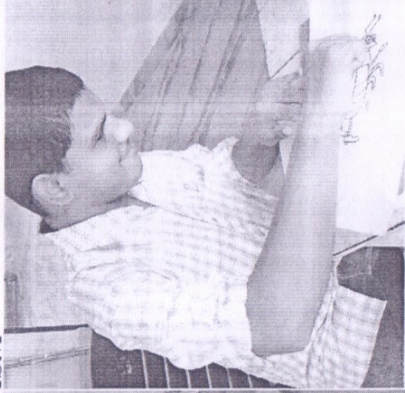
