Adarsh Para Medical Welfare Association Registered by Govt. of Haryana under Act. 1860 Vide Resolution no-21 Reference no-9 Dated 19th May, 2004. Society has Clinical Services which are of high quality as well as comprehensive. It is thus not surprising that a large number of clients from across the country visit institute to seek treatment. The services include diagnosis and treatment of mental retardation, physically handicapped, cerebral palsy, multiple handicapped, autism, learning disability, aphasia, dyslexia, hearing-aid evaluation, listening training, and communication disorders programmes. Adarsh Para Medical Welfare Association working in the Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation field and Special Educational / Vocational Training for Mentally & Physically Handicapped and Playing arrangement in the Adarsh Medical Institute of Education and Research Centre ,Bhiwani (HR.) from last Sixteen years.

The disabilities enumerated as per PWD Act,1995 are Low-Vision, Blindness, Locomotors disability, Hearing Impairment, Mental Retardation, Mental Illness, Leprosy cured persons, and as per National Trust Act,1999 for the welfare of persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation & Multiple Disabilities.

Adarsh Para Medical Welfare Association has been providing Vocational Industrial Training, Para-Medical programme, General Education, Special Education and Rehabilitation Training of the Children with Special Needs.

Association aims to provide with disabilities towards empowerment on rights mode through holistic approach. The holistic approach has covers programme of prevention, identification, early intervention, education, vocational training, live hood and independent living services, while rehabilitation services will provide physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, audio logical services, psychological therapy, family support etc. Association also work on creating enabling and empowering environment by building capacities in the community towards barrier free environment, community mobilization and self help group formation and activation.

Main Objectives of the Association:

1. Build capacities in the communities of the state haryana districts in and around Bhiwani to services at least 1.5lacs persons with disabilities.
2. Build prosthetic and Orthotic Workshop to manufacture low cost and eco based assistive devices and augmentative devices for Persons with disabilities.
3. To provide therapeutics and other rehabilitation services to cater to the needs of at least 400 persons with disabilities in a month.
4. Create awareness in the communities to enlist their support in the village.
5. Develop facilities to train at least 500 rehabilitation professionals to meet the Humen Resource requirment of the disability rehabilitation area.
6. Develop facilities to train at least 2000 professionals to meet the Humen Resource requirment field of the Rehabilitation.
7. Develop and strengthen self help groups and Parent Association in the rural areas.

Adarsh Para medical welfare Association has started A Open Shelter Home in the year 2014.

Vision

A safe, secure and nurturing environment for lost, runaway and separated children to grow holistically with self-confidence, self-worth and dignity.

Mission

To create a safe and secure environment for runaway children rescued from street child ,Salam Area ,run way children ,migrant population, beggars etc . Also to reunite the run away or separated children with their families and address the causes that leads them to run away with an aim to prevent them from repeating the behavior.

Counselor

“As a counselor, I always wondered what made young children run away. Now, I understand children have problems at home and they decide ‘in a moment’ to solve the problem by escaping from it. These children are full of energy and need to be guided. A guide can help them face their problems and channelize their energy in constructive ways.”

Inspection of OSH: - DCPO Unit and CWC have inspection every months and state Govt. HSCRPC member has also visited the OSH.

Sports and Cultural Activity: - Many students has participated in Distt Level Game and State level game and won the medal in different sports and cultural activity.

Govt. School admission: - In the academic year we have send 18 students in Govt. school.

Other work; The open shelter Home counselor and outreach worker do many services to the Govt. as awareness, home study report , **COVID-19**and other.

Rehabilitation: Our outreach worker has rehabilitate many children with their parents as Kulvinder S% Sh. Jaswant(UP), KUSHI, and 13 children was rescue from Tigrana Mor Industries as child labor .

Adarsh Rehabilitation Centre Vikas Day Care Center under the National Trust

Adarsh Para medical welfare Association has registered under The National Trust from 2011. The R.O. has start Vikas day Care Center scheme under The National Trust from May 2016. In this scheme we have enrolled BPL, LIG and Non Lig CWSN in MR/CP/MD/ASD 40 students. Adarsh Para Medical Welfare Association has known historically, being an agrarian, India is endowed with a large population living in rural area. Indian villages are traditionally known for their culture of community living. Persons with Disabilities are treated as equals and part of the community and they are eventually included. They are provided due care and rehabilitation services through institution of family. Indeed, many of mild and moderate ones used top get mingled and had the social acceptance in the mainstream. The institution of family used to be a major strength in the care of the persons with severe and profound disability.

The families of the persons with disabilities, particularly the parents and siblings do also have needs different from others, which cannot be segregated from the special needs of the children with disabilities, if our intention is to extend proper rehabilitation services. Some of the important family needs are information about of the child, management of the child, services available, vocational rehabilitation, marriage issue of the child, emotional needs, social acceptance, etc. In my opinion, the needs of the families having a child with disabilities have a bearing on the rehabilitation services of the persons with disabilities. The biggest need of a parent, which is yet to be answered particularly, is **“What will happen to our child after us?”** This is the ultimate challenge in the area of rehabilitation.

Childline services 1098 at Bhiwani and Sonipat

Adarsh Para medical welfare Association has started Childline services 1098 at Bhiwani; Haryana from 2019. It is a 24-hour a day, 365 days a year, free, emergency phone **service** for children in need of aid and assistance. We not only respond to the emergency needs of children but also link them to relevant **services** for their long-term **care** and rehabilitation. The service focuses on the needs of children living alone on the streets, child laborers, domestic, and workers run away children, children of sex workers and sexually abused children.

RESPONDING TO CHILDREN IN DISTRESS

CHILDLINE is a phone outreach based intervention model and the work begins when a call for help comes in. As soon as this happens, local CHILDLINE teams are informing for direct intervention. Intervention covers a range of activities from rescuing children from abuse, providing immediate SOS attention, to registering a case at the police station, presenting a child to the child welfare committee (CWC) in the city, developing the paperwork for onward action as directed by the CWC and so on. Some take less than an hour to resolve whereas others take

months of work. CHIDLINES operational model involves the team activating linkages to the allied system such as the police, Municipality, Healthcare, Education and Transport Institutions along with Judiciary, Child care NGOs local, state and central Governments. Very often, the team has to provide unique solutions that require a relevant interpretation of legislations such as the Juvenile Justice Act as well as brief allied institutions on exceptional issues.

20th September, 2019 The Childline has received a call and the caller told us her Step Father bad touching in every time when she is alone. The Childline produced her in front of CWC and lose the FIR.

25th September, 2019 The Childline has received a call from Girl Athletics and they tell when we do Exercise in the Stadium, some boys were made video and put the comments on us. The Childline has lose the FIR against those boys with the help District Administration.

26th September, 2019 The Childline has received a call and the Caller tells about the Posco Case. The Childline rescue the child and reached in hospital for the Medical and produced the case in CWC and lose the FIR against victim.

CHILDLINE SE DOSTI WEEK: The Childline has celebrated a Week from 11th -16th Nov. 2019 'CHILDLINE SE DOSTI WEEK' in this week Childline has organized many function, cultural activities, sports, painting competition.


