We also providing supplementary food for physical growth and proper nourishment of the children. We also extend our support service of free transportation facility for the children with disabilities to attain proper child development at early stage of their life.

HIGHLIGHTS DESCRIPTION

1. Enrollment of children to Preschool Education

Children with different disabilities get enrolled for Early Intervention & School Readiness programme, admitted children are monitored regularly and monitor their developments quarterly and supported on various physiotherapy services with varied activities for further developments. We ensured transportation with free of cost for been regularized attendance. Totally 12 children enrolled to DISHA program for the period 2020 -2021.

2. Parents Capacity Building Training Programmes

Ashadeepa organization has engaged parents continuously even COVID outbreak; we have organized virtual (online-ZOOM) meeting to deliver need based services and activities for their children at home with precautions of COVID. We not allowed staff of Disha programme to organized physical classes for children and no stakeholders meeting. We tried to teach parents more on various need based services for their children to practice independently at hope. Each staff have submitted 3 months action plans for take initiative virtual only and we get succeeded to train the parents. Parents have carried daily living activities themselves, and motivated them towards government entitlements for health subsidies, enrolment for Niramaya and other needs.







Children also joined with parents and enjoying virtual meet which inspired us lot to do more for their well being and further developments. Parents have coped up with all hurdles and engaged themselves constantly. Many activities and services had been delivered through virtual meet itself. Parents developed their core skills and knowledge on varied therapies, activities. Also promote them for government schemes, health entitlements, and insurance like Niramaya to claim their medical expenditure.

Ashadeepa organization has deeper commitment with its beneficiaries in community from the inception, this helps to reach out more no. of beneficiaries based on its projects, programmes. During COVID pandemic we have stopped to visit homes, villages and take almost all actions virtual mode to engage various beneficiaries for certain services day to day. Initially it has found as challenge to understand them, many of from poor economic background and does not have access of smart phones, but parents understand that they have to buy smart phone for getting certain facilities like others. Parents have provided trainings often and get learned about using smart phone for attending meeting through ZOOM link. Through this we have created community awareness on COVID pandemic as well Disha Programme for school readiness and Early Intervention.

4. Virtual Meetings for Parents/ Parents Association for Children with Disabilities

Parents are crucial and as equally responsible to work hard like Disha staff to work hard for achieving development milestones, preschool activities for overall development of children with National Trust disabilities. In this juncture we have more involved parents to understand programme objectives and aim to drive right based services independently at home. Actually COVID helps us to develop parents' skills and make them more independent through virtual meet and rendered many skills and knowledge.







Below mentioned Activities trained to Parents

Sorting games Activity: Sorting playing articles, cards, cereals are good for gross and fine motor control. I recommend that you play sorting games on a regular basis because the repetitive motion of muscles helps teach the brain and muscles to work together. Have them sort colored paper clips that are colorful and big enough for them to pick up. For example, have them put blue ones in a basket on the right and red ones on the left. Make sure that whatever the item, they can grab it and manipulate it in a relaxed manner. Don't overwhelm them with a large quantity. The key is to keep it as fun as possible.

Gross Motor Activity

Gross motor skills are those used to move your arms, legs, and torso in a functional manner. Gross motor skills involve the large muscles of the body that enable such functions as walking, jumping, kicking, sitting upright, lifting, and throwing a ball. Acquiring motor skills is an important part of child development that allows children to participate in varied activities and achieve age appropriate development milestones. We also observe the child development on below mentioned strength that child can attain the proper development

- Muscle strength/tone
- Balance

Toys with a variety of colors and shapes Activity

Children usually like bright colors and big shapes. Sometimes with cerebral palsy brightness can make our muscles tighten up. So, have toys and pictures with a variety of colors, shapes, and sizes to try to avoid overstimulation.

Arts and crafts Activity

Arts and crafts are excellent for any preschooler. With a child who has cerebral palsy, all you need to do is keep it real for their needs. Most everything can be adapted, and you can use teamwork to accomplish a task. Cutting, beads on a string, coloring, and painting are great for motor skills. Remember not to do the project for them. Let them do what they can.

Ball Throw & Catch Activities

- Playing with balls makes physical activity fun. And also throwing, catching, rolling & kicking balls
 - Works arm and leg muscles
 - Improves hand-eye coordination
 - · Increases fitness.
- When special need children practice ball skills, they will notice their skills improving. This helps special need children understand that they can learn and get better at something if they try. And this builds self-esteem and confidence.

Note: All activities information shared with parents by Disha staff and parents have drove activities at home independently. This had happen due to COVID outbreak and staff completely engaged in their project related task through virtual meets.

Children and parents shave supported by skills, knowledge and COVID Relief assistance. We have recognized by many individuals towards support for persons with disabilities during COVID outbreak.

Sitting Corner exercise

This leads to control over the neck; body and child get position to sit properly in accordance with his physical growth.

Standing with Guitars exercise

This exercise will help strengthen all parts of the legs, control over the body to stand firmly. This is one of the most important activities to carry out for the betterment of children with disabilities.

Gate Training exercise

This particular service helps child to build the ability of stand, walk gradually. This is a very important service that physiotherapist can suggest parents to practice. Some other goals of gait training include:

- · Increasing muscle strength and coordination in the legs
- Increasing flexibility, cardiovascular fitness, and balance

Balance Board exercise

Balance board workouts are a training method involving a series of standing and weight-bearing exercises completed on an unstable surface. They aim to train the muscles around the ankle and improve balance.

Conclusion: Ashadeepa organization have strive hard and reached few milestones during COVID outbreak, We thank all support grantees agencies and private funding agencies to make our effort more fruitful and happy to take further additional support service for children with disabilities and sharing knowledge with parents to grow as trainee for the welfare of children.




7. Niranthara-2 Organization Capacity Building Programme



Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of M/s. ASHADEEPA ANGAVIKALARA SARVA ABHIWRUDDHI SEVA SAMSTHE (A Society registered under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2021, the Statement of Income and Expenditure and the Receipts and Payments Account for the year ending March 31, 2021.
