Mahalshwar - A Parent Intiative

Introduction:

Mahalshwar based in Mayiladuthurai is a parent intiative in the disability Sector. Mahalshwar give rehabitation services for persons with neurological impairments like cerebral palsy, mental retardation, Autism, Learning disabilities and multiple disabilities. The centre was founded on September 9th 2003 by Mrs. Kungumaeswari. It began with 2 students and today has a strength of 50 students.

Genesis:

Ms. Kunguma Eswari is the mother of two children with neurological impairments. Intially she was of a loss as to how to manage the needs of the children. From June 1987, she began to access the services of Vidya Sagar, Chennai (Formerly Spastics of India). She attended the Out Station program run for families outside Chennai. Here learnt the basic skills needed to manage disability.

Motivated by the difference technical guidance made to quality of her life and her children, she soon decided to create services in her home town of Mayiladuthurai for such families who could not access any service. Her interest led her to train further under the Community Based Rehabilitation Project of Vidya Sagar as field worker. She underwent training as a resource

person from the year 1995. She has completed the Bridge Course for field workers which is a 40 day training program in 2003. She did a 6 month placement at Vidya Sagar in the year 2002-03 wherein she was placed in all departments at the institution.

In the year 2003-04 she launched a project "MahaIshwar" in her hometown of Mayiladuthurai in memory of her daughter Mahalakshmi and Ishwar son of Poonam Natarajan, founder of Vidya Sagar, (Mahalakshmi and Ishwar passed away in the Period 1999-2002 away on account of complications arising out of severe disabilities).

Services relating to disabilities:

Mahalshwar give early intervention training for children upto age 6. Government early intervention program has been runup by Mahalshwar from 2015. 3 Special educators are working on this program and yearly 30 Children are benefitted by this program. Vocational training for persons with disabilities has also been done very well in Mahalshwar. Parent training is another main service given by Mahalshwar.

Perspective:

Disability movement is a young movement to other development issues. The last 40 Years have seen a tremendous shift in the manner in which disability is viewed. From the medical and charity based approach, to day the disability sector is talking about human rights and development approach. The focus of the disability movement is to ensure equal opportunities and

participation in mainstream life. The underlying philosophy guiding disability work in INCLUSION in all spheres of life-education, employment, leisure etc.,

The work of Mahalshwar is also geared towards ensuring that is students are provided all opportunities of inclusive education and mainstream life. Since Mahalshwar also believes that disability is a development issue, it is committed to working with all stakeholders in the process of development including the government, the private educational and employment institutions and the community at large. Mahalshwar will be an active advocate of the rights of the disabled person as provided under the law.

Activities of Mahalshwar:

- 1. Early intervention programs for babies upto the age of six years in all areas of development. It is crucial that every disabled child gets the best opportunity to explore and train to cope with its disability. on this early and crucial phase of development.
- 2. Training Parents in the management of children and young adults with neurological impairments including cerebral palsy, Mental retardation, Autism, Learning disabilities and multiple disabilities.

- 3. Support services to children attending mainstream schools intems of Physiotherapy, Speech & Communication therapy and educational guidance.
- 4. Prevocational and vocational training programs for young adults. The focus would be open placement or setting up of group enterprise which would help these young adults to pool in efforts and earn a living.
- 5. Niramaya health insurance scheme (National Trust Scheme) has been provided to morethan 50 pwds every year. This insurance is more useful for each PWD who have several health issues.

ADVISORY REFERRAL SERVICES

Parents and students of Mahaishwar have accessed the out station assessment and program planning, program offered. Main stream school teachers have been trained by us to work with disabled kids studying in main stream schools.

These visits are made to supplement to services offered at Mahalshwar. A part from planning comprehensive intervention programs in areas of physiotherapy, communication and education, difficult medical reviews in case of vision problems and epilepsy are addressed during these visits.

- 3. Advisory services.

EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM

In this year we do this program by online classes and by home visits. This is geared towards improving the management and handling skills of parents with young children with neurological impairments in the age group from birth to 6 years. This year, the program focused on training the parents in the area of physiotherapy, communication skills, vision training, sensory integration, occupational therapy, activities of daily living and games. Inputs in readiness for education have also been provided.

Class and by home visits number of 30.

PRE VOCATIONAL STREAM:

A combination of functional education, maintenance therapy, job skills and concepts of time and money are the important features of this stream. This year the products paper machete baskets, food mat and note pad were made in the group through shared responsibilities. Skills of hand function, shared responsibilities and time management were the focus. This group is focusing on building foundation for adult life and skills required there in. In this year we do this program by online classes and by home visits.

Number of student in this group: 20

ADVISORY SERVICES

There are a set of parents who are unable to access series regularly. Hence they visit Mahalshwar (once a month, sometimes once in six months) and get support services. Sometimes it is a onetime assessment with referral services.
