

TREASURER'S REPORT

I present the Treasurer's Report for the year 2019-20.

As in the past, SPASTN had during the year, continued its activities to fulfill its noble objectives despite the numerous challenges being faced. This had been made possible mainly thanks to the generous support received from philanthropists during the year. We have completed one more year of fulfilling our commitments to the society-at-large and the various donors and we are resolved to face the year in running (i.e. the year 2020-21) and meeting the challenges in the manner SPASTN is used to.

As stated in the previous years' reports, the Government of India in the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has been supporting and funding our Society to the extent of 90% of its expenditure. However, as a matter of policy, the Government has been gradually reducing the grant support which covers around 15% of our total expenditure. There were also delays which meant we had to find finances to meet those exigencies in the interim which had brought enormous pressure on the functioning of SPASTN. It should be noted that SPASTN had not received any amounts from the Government and yet managed to keep up the good work without any diminution in the services it has been providing in the past.

However, one should be realistic and considering these circumstances, it is inevitable that SPASTN will have to explore alternative avenues for funding its activities in future.

Challenges facing SPASTN in the current year

While presenting the Treasurer's Report for the year 2019-20, SPASTN noted that the points of concern mentioned last still are matters of concern. It is disappointing to note that there has been no improvement in the fiscal environment SPASTN has been operating in and if anything there is only a worsening of these conditions.

These are listed again for the attention of the members.

- 1. The economy which was in a downswing and just as it began to improve, was hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. It is not necessary to go into the details since everyone is aware of the extraordinary hardships the country has gone through. One hopes that the worst is behind us and things can only go up from this point onwards...
- 2. Interest rates have come down substantially resulting in lower income by way of interest on our deposits with financial institutions. We earn a lot less than what we did in the past.
- 3. Expenses are as usual going up constantly with mobilisation of resources always playing a catchup in order to continue with the activities and services that SPASTN had been rendering to the Society-at-large.
- 4. Support from the Government is diminishing.
- 5. There are many worthy causes that other charities are championing in different segments of our lives. There is more competition from organizations for the funds that are available with donors.

Given that these are circumstances over which we have no control, the only way we can maintain our ability to continue as an institution which is capable of delivering quality service in our chosen avenues is by increasing our resources. Of all the avenues, the most preferable solution, in order to be reasonably self-sufficient we need to mobilize sufficient resources which would earn us income by way of earning of

interest. This would help SPASTN continue to function without facing a resource constraint and would free us from diverting our attention to mobilizing resources which is occupying a high degree of time. The silver lining is that, one must acknowledge that globally awareness is spreading and wealthy nations are looking at outlets for philanthropic activities. It would be our endeavour to spread the message of SPASTN not only nationally but also internationally so that potential donors will recognize the noble work being done by SPASTN and will come forward with generous contributions. For this SPASTN needs assistance from everyone.

Early Intervention Programme: No. Students: 13

Play way method of teaching was introduced to the Early Intervention Group. At present we have 13 students in our EI group at the age of 1 year to 5 years. All the students underwent medical intervention like Visual Screening, Auditory Screening and Neurological evaluation. From this group 4 children are

placed in play school and Balwadi. They are getting physiotherapy or sensory integration, speech therapy and counseling and guidance. Introduce Yoga, Singing and dancing, pre-writing skill, coloring work, Sitting tolerance, Activities for daily living activities and Attention span increasing activities given.

All students underwent medical intervention like Visual Screening, Auditory Screening, Dental screening and Neurological evaluation. New parents have participated in our Parent training on the topic of Orientation of all the Intervention, and the Benefits of Holistic Approach

At present we have 79 students with Multiple Disability in our school. We have provided all the medical intervention and training for them. Our students and parents have participated in all the festivals and district level sports and State level cultural. Many of our MD children have won many prizes. Six staffs are working in this unit. The staff handling this unit has attended CRE, State level training, Regional level training, In-services and National training on Deafblindness, Capacity building, Regional training on Deafblindess. 8 students with MD are studying in regular schools.

Deafblind Unit:

With the help of Sense International India SPASTN started a separate unit at Old Washermenpet, branch for children with deaf blindness. At present SPASTN have 22 students in this unit. 0-6 early intervention group has 3 students, 6- 18 years primary group has 19. From primary group, Miss. Mowthika and Janavi studying in class 5 and 2 at regular school. 19 parents joined in family network programme and 5 staffs joined in professional network programme. The entire group of students with parents visited 5 Churches in Chennai, Eco Park, Gundy Park and Birla Planetarium, VGP Wonder, World aquarium. Jeeva prakash, Janavi, Akshana and Nithishkumar participated in District sports in the Category of Deafblindness.

Parents and staff attended State level, Regional and National level training held at Delhi, Trivandrum and Chennai.

Autism: There are 20 students attending this group. 6 students studying in regular school. 8 students attending in bridge group. 3 students are attending early intervention group. Avaz, 9 non verbal students communicate with their AAC boards. Brain gym, Drawing, Special education, Communication, Sensory integration, Yoga, Music, group activities and Calendar system, shopping skills followed in this group. Next year 1 student promoted to skill training unit. 4 students studying in regular school.

L.K.G AND U.K.G: No. of Students:14

From this group 3 students are studying in regular school. The entire students are getting holistic approach training. Apart from this they are learning cutting, pasting, folding the paper, Drawing,

storytelling, group play, Music therapy, Sports activities and Computer class. 1 student promoted to Skill training unit next year.

Skill Training Unit: No. of Students: 24

13 Boys and 11 girls are studying in this class. Both have separate class rooms. They are getting Special Education, Physiotherapy, Sensory integration, Communication, Yoga, Time, Money, ADL Skills, Privacy and Sex education, Leisure time activities like dusting, cleaning of vessels, cooking and washing clothes, Shopping skill, Drawing and Painting, Dance, Sports & Craft work. Started Artificial Jewelry like Bangle, Chain, and Hearings etc.. 4 students from this group studying in regular school.

2 girls with severe Multiple Disability attended weekly once maintenance group.

Staff Development:

Our staff had a wonderful opportunity to upgrade their knowledge in the field of disability through training programs, in-services, seminars and National training on the topic of Handling techniques for children with MD, Documentation, Capacity building and Management skills. Our staffs are capable to present on Specified topics when required.

- 483 persons were trained on Early identification, Early intervention and Inclusion,
- 40 Awareness programs were conducted and reached about 2145 People and
- 767 (no of visits) Home Based program are carried out for need-based children along with the family and community participation.

New Initiatives:

Basic Counseling Skill Training -

Parent-to- Parent support is the intended outcome of this training.

Conducted Basic Counselling skill training Programme for parents at Padiyanallur CBR centre, in which 20 Parents were participated on 25th&26th September 2019,

- Enhance the Effective coping skill
- Improve the ability to establish and maintain relationship
- Promote the decision making process ,
- Facilitate behavioural change.

Installed Glow At A Sight (GLASs):

GLASs is a Therapeutic Toolto train the Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD) children. ADHD is a mental disorder of the neurodevelopmental type. It is characterized by difficulty paying attention, excessive activity, and behavior without regards to consequences which is not appropriate for aperson's age.

From October 2019, CBR team are using the equipment across 5centres (Redhills, Padiyanallur, Minjur, Thiruvallur, Perambakkam). Work on it is in progress.

Poshan Abhiyan:

It's a prime scheme launched by Prime Minister to promote maternal and child nutrition. It aims at achieving improvement in nutritional status of children up to 6 years of age, adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers. Reproductive health is essential for all women and that starts in the first 6 years. CBR-DID will dove tail with the scheme so that project children and their mother's are provided the essential nutritional intake. We have conducted Nutrition Day programme at Padiyanallur CBR centre by ICDS workers.

<u>Our work so far:</u> We have conducted health camp for parents and in all the centers in that we did blood test to know the haemoglobin level, checked for height and weight to know whether the child is normal or under weight or obese. Totally 83 children and 70 parents were assessed, out of that 74 had a low Hb

level, 22 are under weight.

Identified children and parents were given nutritional counseling and diet plan by Dr.Jagadeesh kumar , Paediatrician at District Early Intervention Centre , Thiruvallur GH and referred 9 children's to their respective balwadi's for improving their weight and Hb level . Two lactating mothers were registered in Balwadi and taking Amylase powder to improve child's nutrition through breast feeding.

Parent Training:

We organized one day Training Programme on Importance of Communication, Feeding Positions and Oro motor Exercises for Parents at Minjur, Padiyanallur and Perambakkam CBR Centre.

New Linkages with Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS):

The Spastics Society of Tamilnadu partnered with the Red Cross Society organized one day health assessment camp at Padiyanallur Centre to minimize the issue related with immediate assessment for the identified persons with risk to deaf blindness, supported by Sense International India. 63 Children's (63Parents) from various parts of Thiruvallur district were attended.

Outcomes of the camp:

- 63 children were attended the camp.
- > 13 children were referred to MN Hospital for further visual related clinical assessment.
- > 10 children were referred for spectacles, Measurement taken.
- 5 children were advised to clear the wax in ears with the ear drops prescribed by the ENT Specialist.
- > 30 children weredone dentalscaling.
- > 10 children were done dental filling.
- Dentist advised to all the parents to ensure brush their children teeth twice a day.
- > Measurements taken to 10 children for Spectacles, 10 children were received spectacles.
- Measurement taken to 30 children for Assistive devices. 10 children were received assistive devices from Honourable Governor on 28th January 2020. Others will receive soon.

Livelihood Training Programme:

This year our SPASTN CBR conducted tailoring training in Padiyanallur and Minjur centers for 26 members with parent child model. In this year 22 members were attended Tailoring exam and applied for tailoring machine at District Differently Abled Welfare Office (DDAWO).

- 8 Members were received tailoring machines from District Differently Abled Welfare Office of Thiruvallur District.
- 9 Members were received from Indian Medical Association and Rotary club of Thiruvallur District.

In Padiyanallur vocational training unit, under vocational training around 14 young adults with Disabilities are getting training for making door mats. This year we started jewellery making. We are continuing door mats and paper bags ..

Deaf Blind Programme:

SPASTN CBR is supported by Regional Learning Centre of Sense International India which operates through the project team based in SPASTN Royapuram.

This year we initiated <u>Helen Keller day programme at Thiruvallur GH</u> along with SPASTN Royapuram. Speech competition was conducted to normal school students about Helen Keller and distributed prizes for the winners. Awareness training on deafblindness to the parents and professionals was carried out.

Functional Assessment campwas conducted by professionals from SPASTN Royapuram at Padiyanallur CBR center.

Outcomes

- 18 children were assessed
- 10 Audiometry carried out
- ❖ 7 children went to Sankara Nethralaya Hospital for Clinical Vision Assessment.
- ❖ BERA Done for 3 children at Medical Research Centre, Mylapore


