## MESSAGE



**INTRODUCTION ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION**

Lok Jagriti Sansthan is a reputed voluntary organization incorporated under Indian Societies Registration Act, 1860 vide registration no 1999. Being a NGO, it is a non-political and non-profit oriented in its workings and was established in the year 1999. It is being managed by a dedicated team of social activists and volunteers with a view of facilitating the under privileged section of the society to plan, implement, monitor and evaluate programme designed by their own growth and development. It has been providing support to the disadvantaged sections of the community by encouraging their active participation in all level so as to develop a self reliant society with a focus on socio-economic empowerment of the community especially women as decision makers in the development process. The organization is situated at Ambedkar Nagar with its main office at Village Pahunti, Post Saya, District Ambedkar Nagar, U.P. The organization is also registered under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 and has also been granted necessary exemption under section 12Aa of the Income Tax Act 1961.

The philosophy and vision of Mahatma Gandhi and Acharya Vinoba Bhave have been the guiding principles for the organization for the purpose of undertaking rural development under which 'Antyodaya' of the under privileged and poor among the rural folk have been primarily targeted as the beneficiaries. In line with the same the organization has undertaken various development projects in the field of Health & Family welfare, Education, Women Empowerment, Environment & Sanitation, Sustainable Agriculture & Horticulture, Vocational Training & Poverty alleviation programmes.

The organization is being managed by a dedicated team of social activists and volunteers with a view of facilitating the under privileged section of the society to plan, implement, monitor and evaluate programme designed by their own growth and development. It has been providing support to the disadvantaged sections of the community by encouraging their active participation in all level so as to develop a self-reliant society with a focus on socio-economic empowerment of the community especially women as decision makers in the development process.

**Vision and Mission**

**Vision** - The organization's vision is to achieve an egalitarian society devoid of any deprivation, exploitation and neglect by enabling socio-economic development of the disadvantaged and deprived sections with their active involvement and collaboration.

**Mission** - The Mission of the organization is to work for sustainable holistic development by empowering rural community with focus on women and children by providing quality education, health care, family welfare, vocational/skill development training and creation of awareness on various aspects including conservation of environment, promotion of sanitation and inculcation of human values and culture thereby achieving the overall objectives of all-round development of the deprived sections of the society.



## OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Lok Jagriti Sansthan has the main objective to work for the overall development of the poor, downtrodden and disadvantaged sections of people without any discrimination of castes, creed and religion so that the targeted beneficiaries join together, generate a fellow feeling, work together and devote themselves positively for mutual development and the overall development of the society.

### FOR THIS PURPOSE IT HAS MANY OTHER SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES WHICH INCLUDE:

- Behavioral Transformation
- Building community ownership for promotion of education
- Skill/capacity building and sustainable livelihood
- Conduct Research and Evaluation studies

- Women and child welfare
- Handicraft and cottage industry development
- Providing advocacy support for rights and entitlement of poor and socially ignored sections and Minority groups.
- Rural infrastructure development
- Environment conservation and rural infrastructure development.

## GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE

As far as the geographical spread of the organization's activities is concerned, the organization is actively working in the district Ambedkar Nagar of the State of Uttar Pradesh. It has taken up various developmental programmes for providing income generation activities, handicraft development/ capacity-building trainings, and activities to develop education, agriculture, women empowerment and health. It is a matter of credit for the organization that its activities through various programmes have reached more than a lakh people particularly of the weaker sections of the

rural and urban areas and made commendable changes in their living conditions. This has been made possible by the community-led development programmes and networking of NGOs working in the related areas by the organization.



**CORE COMPETENCY:** The organization has its core competency for conducting surveys and research work in rural remote areas, urban slums, implementing development projects and programmes, imparting skill development training and capacity building for competency development and achieving employment and to start self employment ventures, rural/urban infrastructure development and social reforms.

## INFRASTRUCTURE AND MANAGEMENT:

**MANAGEMENT BODY:** An agency operated by a board consisting of 09 members. The officers are the chairman, vice-president, general secretary, secretary and treasurer and the remaining 04 are members of the committee. The board meets regularly on a quarterly basis. Board members, apart from playing advisory roles in the organization, are also associated with thematic areas of the organization. All programs are audited by the quarterly Board of Assessors.



The board passes necessary resolution before submitting programmes and projects for approval to the donor departments/agencies. In matters of recruitment and appointments, procurement of equipments and materials and monitoring financial and programme matters the board exercises necessary control, supervision and direction for achieving optimum results.

**PROGRAMME MONITORING:** The organization conducts regular monthly meetings involving staff and volunteers. All programmatic decisions are taken in the meetings which are conducted in a participatory manner and decisions are arrived at after elaborate discussion. Reporting relationship is also maintained both upwards and downwards with regular flow of information. The board also reviews the work of the organization and gives necessary directions based on feedbacks from field offices.

**FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT:** As far as financial management is concerned, the organization is guided by transparency in operations, and accounts are maintained in systematic manner at all levels. Monthly financial statement is prepared to monitor the financial status of each project. All the accounts (Cash book and ledgers) are maintained on daily basis. For different projects, separate books of accounts are maintained and the same are audited by an external auditor.

**HUMAN RESOURCE:** Human resource is not a constraint for implementing any programme taken up by the organization. A dedicated team of personnel looks after the administration, control, accounts and other related activities of the organization. Besides this, the team of dedicated project staff including field workers, trainers, teachers and volunteers are also engaged. All are qualified and experienced to implement the projects run by the organization. Further the organization has a panel of experts whose services are engaged as and when required as per program needs. The organization follows sound HR principles for recruitment and appointment of staff. An ideal working environment is created so that the full potential of the human resource is delivered for implementation of programmes.

**RAPPORT AND NETWORKING:** The organization maintains good rapport and liaison with various departments and agencies at all levels who have been always helping the organization in implementing programmes. It also continues to maintain good liaison with its well-wishers and donor agencies. It is also maintains good coordination with grass root level functionaries including community leaders, social activists, PRIs and CBOs.

Several co-organizations and well-wishers are an inspiring spirit behind the organization's working and special care is taken to ensure that the federal style of functioning is adopted by the organization to ensure that implementation of programmes ensures cent percent achievement although slight deviations are made wherever it is felt necessary depending on the local conditions.

**CURRENT ROLE AND PRIORITIES:** Lok Jagriti Sansthan plays the role of a socioeconomic development organization with the primary aim to reach out to the grass root level where deprived and disadvantaged people are identified and all possible helps are made available to make them stand on own legs and strive for better opportunities. It envisages to enlarge its membership by enrolling likeminded persons with commitment towards selfless service to the society. At the grass root level it also takes in more and more dedicated volunteers with the objective to support those hapless persons and develop their leadership skills. In all the programmes the emphasis is to serve women, children and youths who have got a major role to play in the society. Playing an advocacy role the organization has been constantly presenting before the authorities at all levels the problems and grievances of deprived people in programme areas and pleading for approval of humanitarian schemes and programmes which can become a turning point for betterment of their lives. It is to the credit of the organization that this role has been producing the desired results in as much as thousands of poor people at the grass root level have been uplifted and made to join the mainstream of society in various districts of the State.



**ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING – 2019-20**

Twenty One Annual General Meeting of Lok Jagriti Sansthan was conducted at its Head Quarters at Village Pahunti, Post Saya, District Ambedkar Nagar on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2019. ## PROJECTS/PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES FY 2019-2020

### Vikas Day Care Scheme

Divyang (Mentally retarded, multi-handicapped, cerebral-palsy, autism) is a day care center for children April, by Lok Jagriti Sansthan Gram Pahunti Post Saya District Ambedkar Nagar Uttar Pradesh in collaboration with State Trust Center under the support and guidance of National Trust New Delhi. Following is the description of 28 children studying in Jagriti Vikas Kendra, which is being conducted since 2017.

The 28 children studying in the institution have the necessary routine of life, they can do it themselves without any help, to develop the habit of normal behavior, social skills for this year, teaching skills, physio therapy skills, vocational skills and physical development. Capacity addition is being done with full morale. Apart from this, in association with National Trust New Delhi and Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities Uttar Pradesh, the organization organized a Divyang Voter Awareness Program, which according to a 3-day work plan, organized a Divyang Voter Awareness Rally.

In which a total of 5 voters were voted, there was a lot of discussion in the field of this work of the institution. Divyang Day was organized by the organization under the guidance of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities; Divyang Awareness Program on the auspicious occasion of World Divyang Day at Jagriti Vikas Kendra Village Pichwara Post Sayya District Ambedkarranagar organized.

In which the district's participation in the Nirman Health Insurance Scheme and Legal Guardianship operated by the Uttar Pradesh Government for Artificial Limb Equipment Scheme, Divyang Pension and National Trust, New Delhi for the support of the disabled is very negligible, while such people in the district are very negligible Number is in thousands. On the special invitation of NTPC Tanda organized on World Divyang Day, 8 children from the backward community of Jagriti Vikas participated in the program organized under the supervision of special teacher Pradeep Kumar Yadav and general secretary of Lok Jagriti Sansthan Aarti Tripathi. Competition, race competition, dance competition, balloon fluffing competition, the children of the center received the first prize. The ability shown by the children was very much appreciated by the Director NTPC Shri Gurdeep Singh, the chairperson of Garima Mahila Mandal, Smt. Swarna met the children.



### World Day of Disability Under Vikas Scheme.

To make the Divyang people aware of the talent existing in them and the efforts being made by the disabled people in the country and abroad, and the government schemes operated by the Government of India and the State Government and the National Trust, New Delhi, for the disabled people and their for the purpose of making the common people aware with parents, Lok Jagriti Sansthan Gram Pahunti has organized the World Divyang Day on December 3, 2019 from 1:11 pm in the premises of Jagriti Vikas Kendra Village Pichhwara under the chairmanship of Institution Head Aarti Tripathi and Shri Surendra Kumar Pandey. schemes supported the disabled With this, to provide health insurance to these children, Niramaya Health Insurance is charging 250 rupees for BPL children and 500 rupees for APL children in this program. Up to 1 lakh of medicines of registered PwD can be given from a registered hospital, which is fully paid by the National Trust, New Delhi, to the children affected by four types of special disabilities. With this, there is a provision to provide legal guardianship for the differently-abled person by applying to the LLC (Local Level Committee) under the chairmanship of the District Officer at the district level after these children are 18 years of age. There is a permanent option to provide security to the future of the family, so that the legal right of the PwD on his ancestral property and property will remain till his death, therefore all the parents are requested to obtain a certificate from the legal guardian of their children, besides the state government. The facilities such as prosthetic limb equipment, trai bicycle, wheelchair, crutches, stick ring machine are provided by the Department of Disability Empowerment and NTPC Tanda to the disabled Chief guest of the program Surendra Pandey said that the efforts being made by the people reached the Jagriti Vikas Kendra for the differently abled are doing a very commendable and exemplary work in this area and for the district, which has started showing happiness in the lives of the differently-abled as well. Also commend this effort of the institution, the program was concluded by the head of the organization Arti Tripathi with a vote of thanks from the guests, parents, children and other citizens of the area.



### • EMPOWERING DALIT WOMEN AND OTHER MARGINALIZED GROUPS FOR BETTER ACCESS TO THEIR LIVELIHOOD

This is the programme for Empowering Dalit Women for better access to their livelihood. The project is being implementing in 20 villages under 8 Gram Panchayats of block Tanda in the district Ambedkar Nagar with the financial assistance of CASA, New Delhi. The project has been implementing since December 2013. In continuation of its efforts, Lok Jagriti Sansthan, has given special focus to improve the situation of Dalit women and other marginalized groups as they are the largest socially segregated and discriminated groups everywhere.

Several components including formation of community organizations advocacy and campaign gender mainstreaming planning



monitoring and evaluation coordination meetings network and alliance building activities etc. was organized by the agency for empowering and emboldening the women belonging to socially ignored sections (Dalit category). It has conducted several meetings, carried out surveys and studies and has found a large number of Dalit women and other marginalized groups living below poverty line. Around 1501 families were covered under project and has already



organized awareness meetings, skill development and capacity building training, advocacy support to socio-economic, political, cultural and health inputs and enabling them to be main actors in the process of their empowerment, thereby contributing towards overall development and achieve a better standard of life. The organization has received encouraging response from the beneficiaries and the donor agency for the successful implementation of the project.

### • WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AWARENESS AND CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

As already stated women especially rural women lack awareness of many matters external to their environment but which have a bearing on their living. Despite the governments and other agencies launched many welfare schemes for women's emancipation and advancement the same are not been availed of by rural women mainly because of the lack of awareness. Aware of such state of affairs, the organization had during the year under review launched many awareness programmes in rural areas through which thousands of women have been educated.



The activities included provision of details of the various government schemes for livelihood enhancement, health care initiatives, literacy promotion and leadership development. They were also educated on legal awareness on many issues. Their rights and protections available under

various Acts in regard to property, domestic violence, divorce and maintenance, dowry prohibition, equal remuneration, labour laws, maternity benefits, SITA, RTE, RTI etc. were explained and proper advice was given to approach legal aid services association which espouse women's causes. Sufficient information was also given about details of women activists and social activists who are always helpful to needy women.





## CHILD WELFARE INITIATIVE

Child welfare initiatives of the organization focus to their health care and education. Accordingly during the year under review the organization has carried out many child welfare activities in the programme districts. Some of the important initiatives taken up by the agency during the reporting year are as follows:

### • **SETTING UP OF DAY CARE CENTRE FOR DIVYANG CHILDREN UNDER VIKAAAS SCHEME:**

The organization initiated a programme for providing all possible support to Divyang Children. On the occasion it has started setting up of a Day Care centre during the month March, 2017 with the financial assistance of National Trust, Empowerment to provide vocational training and other programme is to provide day care the range of opportunities disability attaining the age of 10 interpersonal and vocational to higher age groups. The centre support to Person with Disability is in the Vikaas centre. In addition family members of the PwDs with disabilities covered under the National Trust Act to get some time during the day to fulfil other responsibilities.

### • **National Immunization Program**

As part of the National Tikaran program, a campaign was conducted in Block Tanda, Bhati and Katehari in which women were informed that on first pregnancy, every woman should get 2 vaccines of tetanus toxide (TT). These vaccines can be administered at any time during pregnancy, however to cover premature labor and miscarriage, it is more beneficial to have them early in pregnancy. It must be ensured that there is a difference of 4-6 weeks between the two vaccines. If possible, another vaccine should be administered 4 weeks before the expected delivery date. If a woman had TT in the first pregnancy. Have got the vaccine done and within 5 years of the first pregnancy, she conceives the second pregnancy, then the second pregnancy T.T. Only one vaccine is enough. The vaccine should be administered 4-6 weeks before the expected delivery date.



If there is a difference of 5 years between the first and second pregnancy, then in the second womb - like the first pregnancy, 2 vaccines should be given. If the correct record of vaccines applied in the first womb is not available, then it would be better to have 2 vaccines administered in the second womb even if that pregnancy happened within 5 years of the first pregnancy. These rules also apply to later pregnancies. However, it is better that no more than 2 children should be born under this, 580 Children, 250 Women were benefited.



the government programmes like Pulse Polio Immunization, Vit. A programme etc. in rural areas. During the year under review also the organization undertook immunization programme campaign in many rural areas in its programme districts. The volunteers of the organization were deputed to rural homes and slum areas to educate people and overcome their resistance to Pulse Polio Vaccination etc. These efforts of the organization could produce tangible results as large number of children could be covered under this initiative.

### • WOMEN LABOUR WELFARE PROGRAMME

The organization has been conducting programmes for the welfare of Women labour. During the year under review also it has taken up awareness and education activities during the occasion of International labour day and highlighted the role of the labour in all aspects of human development and the role of women, recognizing their problems, rights and welfare programme for such labour women, sensitization of the society so that the community can move forward with accepting their contribution in development process.

### • GENDER EQUALITY AND JUSTICE PROGRAMME

The agency has been engaged in conducting awareness programme for the purpose of Sensitization to the community for importance of gender equality and Justice. We generally found that such gender discrimination is increasing in the society and our aim was to sensitize the participants and further the community members that both genders are same and to be considered and respected equally in all the sectors. Fifteen such programmes were conducted covering hundreds of participants at different locations i.e. Pahuri, Saya, Tanda in District Ambedkar Nagar during the year under review. It was found that all the participants were very eager to raise their clarifications and queries which were suitably replied and explained by the resource persons and finally they were fully convinced by the aim of the programme.

## HEALTH CARE AND FAMILY WELFARE

(AWARENESS GENERATION CAMP)

Health care and family welfare is our focus areas of the organization since its inception. In this sector maternal and child health care is one of the major target for the last many years. In this context we have carried several programmes in rural and slum areas of urban centers. This year too it has witnessed and has involved in more such activities and holding health care programmes among large people of the lower strata of the society. Some of such activities can be briefly mentioned as under:

### ● HEALTH CARE CAMPS

People of the poor sections of the society are found suffering from health problems on account of malnutrition, improper diet and chronic ailment of one or the other kind which has not been given medical attention due to ignorance, negligence or financial constraints. This is affecting their productive days and the overall family income is suffering. Considering the importance of the same the organization has conducted several health camps with the help of district health administration Kannauj and nearby districts during the year under review. A campaign was organized prior to the health camp in the targeted areas which enabled many people to attend the camps. The medical fraternity organized individual health checkups and prescribed medicines wherever necessary. In cases needing specialized treatment the concerned people were referred to the district hospital for further investigations and treatment.

### PROMOTION OF NUTRITION AND HYGIENE – The organization is well aware of the problems of health,

hygiene and nutrition of the women beneficiaries under the organization. Poverty is telling upon the health of these beneficiaries as well as members of their families. Primary motto of the beneficiaries is seen as earning for their livelihood whereas health related issues are given secondary importance or would be preferred to be ignored. The organization has been regularly counseling these beneficiaries about the need for balanced diet, nutrition, hygiene and sanitation to ward off communicable and chronic diseases.

### ● FAMILY PLANNING AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

A general study conducted by the organization has revealed that the population growth is on the higher side among the poor and deprived families. Illiteracy, poverty, lack of awareness on spacing of children and options of sterilization are the major reasons for frequent pregnancies and high rate of births. Most of the pregnant women have been found undergoing nutritional deficiencies, anemia and lack of medical care. The organization has been engaged in creating awareness about family planning measures in localities of such people and convinced a large number of couple about the remedial measures they have to take. During community meetings counseling services were also provided to the needy women for seeking medical help at nearby government hospitals with the help of health care officials. All these efforts received encouraging response and there have been requests for repetition of the same periodically in more areas.

### ● HIV/AIDS AND OTHER GENETIC DISEASE AWARENESS AND ITS PREVENTION

HIV/AIDS and other genetic disease have been found spreading rapidly in slums of urban centers and rural areas also. A general study conducted by the organization has revealed that there has been lack of awareness in most of the cases and early diagnosis and treatment of the suspected cases have not been carried out. The victims turned to hospitals only when the stage became acute and survival is a question mark.

It has been found that the disease is spread among people of floating population such as migrant laborers, truckers, slum dwellers etc. The organization had conducted awareness cum motivation camps in these areas where large number of such suspected cases have been encouraged to attend. The programme also focused on the general public as to the methods of contracting these diseases, its diagnosis and the facilities of treatment that are available in nearby hospitals. The efforts have been to educate the people about the preventives steps to be taken for avoiding HIV and other infections.

### HEALTH CAMPAIGN FOR MR, CP & AUTISM – Many health camp designed for benefiting mentally retarded,

CP and Autism children was conducted by the organization engaging subject experts and medical persons in many blocks under district Ambedkar Nagar. Information about the camp was given in advance to all the families of the problem – children and they were requested to bring their children to camp. Accordingly most of the children and their parents covered in the survey attended the health camp. Case wise problems were discussed in the camp and necessary counseling was provided to the attendants of each child about the care and steps to be taken at the various stages of growth of the children and the need for compassion and



patience to be shown to those children. These counseling efforts were found convincing and acceptable for implementation by most of the guardians.

### LITERACY AND EDUCATION PROMOTION

Promotion of literacy and education has been one of the prime focus of the organization as the development of people depends on the same. The organization over the years has been taking painstaking efforts in this direction and it is a matter of satisfaction that the organization has been able to establish and run many programmes in the district Ambedkar Nagar and nearby districts.

#### • LITERACY PROMOTION ACTIVITIES AMONG RURAL WOMEN

Promotion of literacy has been one of the continuing programmes of the organization. Thus, the organization concentrates for literacy promotion activities of the beneficiaries enrolled in various programmes particularly in respect of SHGs, trainees of vocational training programme etc. for the last several years. The organization has been conducting literacy classes at various centers. Functional literacy is given importance and once the proficiency is achieved, it is observed that the beneficiaries themselves take the interest to improve their proficiency of reading and writing. With this effort the beneficiaries are able to take maximum mileage out of the various other programmes for which they are one way or the other enrolled. The organization engaged suitable instructors and volunteers for motivating the beneficiaries and attending the literacy classes. These efforts have been appreciated by social activists and prominent persons of the respective areas. Several new education promotional programmes are in the pipeline and the same shall be implemented by the organization during the coming financial years.

#### • EDUCATION PROMOTION FOR SCHOOL DROPOUTS AND OUT OF SCHOOL CHILDREN

The organization has conducted regular study in different villages could found a large number of children who are either school dropouts or non school going but are engaged in one or the other child labour. Most of the children covered during this study have revealed their willingness to go back to school provided the attitude of their parents are changed to become positive. Further they also do not have the means to meet the expenses of education. This way large number of children get dropped out of schools or remain out of the school system. This is an ill-advisable trend. The organization has been trying its best to reverse this trend. During the year under review it had conducted various motivational camps in localities of poor and deprived sections of people. The volunteers of the



organization interacted with their parents and motivated them by explaining the many advantages of sending children to schools and discouraging them from engaging children in labour. In order to further encourage the parents the organization provided them free of cost school education kits consisting of school uniforms, bags, books and stationeries. Further the concerned authorities of the school were approached and persuaded for advocacy support to the said children. All these efforts received encouraging response from parents, children as well as the school authorities.

### OTHER SOCIAL WELFARE INITIATIVES

#### RURAL DEVELOPMENT/ AGRICULTURE AND HORTICULTURE PROMOTION

- **RURAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES:** It is a well-known fact that in rural areas of the State of Uttar Pradesh there are a large sections of poor and deprived people who are facing isolation on account of their poor socioeconomic circumstances. The people are somehow leading their lives and facing many hurdles in their day to day life. Among the difficulties observed, lack of safe drinking water, poor infrastructure



facilities including sanitation, cleanliness, proper health care, electricity etc., are major issues. Women and girls are the major victims for these facilities. In this context the organization for last many taking keen interest in various rural infrastructural development initiatives in many places through awareness generation activities and Shramdhan programme for overcoming such poor state of affairs. This year also it has taken up IEC activities among the rural people and conducted Shramdhan activities which including cleaning of ponds, wells and other water bodies, road maintenance etc. in the villages under many blocks under the programe districts. There were a good comment and appreciation from the general public towards the organization for conducting such humanitarian activities and desired to conduct the same in times to come.

### ● AGRICULTURE AND HORTICULTURE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

The agriculture farmers and horticulture cultivators in the rural areas have hitherto been not prone to the development taking place in these sectors nor there any efforts in making them aware of the same

resulting in a situation where the productivity is low and high. Because of these there is a tendency among farmers to leave the agricultural/horticulture field look for other sources of income. The organization would like to intervene and arrest their flow from Agricultural field and provide sustainable agriculture to the farmers which would generate remunerative income for them. The organization therefore introduced multiple crop system,



concentrate on earmarking a ratio of land for producing commercial crops vis-a-vis other routine produce, and impart training for development of bio-compost, provision of quality seeds at affordable prices and help the farmers to find buyers devoid of exploitation. Likewise promotion of various horticulture products were also conducted among the cultivators and the trainers were provided with information about improving agricultural/horticulture production and in their area. Needless to mention that the funding of the training session was done from own resources of the organization.

### ● STRENGTHENING FARMERS CLUB

The organization has been working for establishment of Farmers Clubs in many locations under districts Ambedkar Nagar. The aim of establishing these clubs are farmers to improve the agriculture productivity in rural areas and making them aware of the same with less cost of production and improve the participation of farmers in continuing in agriculture field. Accordingly the organization has been found that the farmers clubs can contribute a lot for bringing improvement in this situation and therefore the organization would like to intervene and arrest their flow from Agricultural field and supporting them through imparting capacity building training, technology transfer, linkages with banks for credit facilities, and creating awareness to the farmer groups which would generate remunerative income for them and improve their quality of life.

### ● ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION PROGRAMME

Environment conservation is also being focused by the organization for the last many years considering extreme climate change, air and water pollution are a common feature everywhere. The organization believes that if remedial measures are not taken and the trend is not arrested, the situation may develop into serious stage when the health of human beings and animals would be severely affected. This required general awareness creation among the public. Therefore the organization during the year under reporting had conducted awareness campaigns in the district Ambedkar Nagar and nearby districts. The activities included awareness rallies highlighting the importance of conserving and protecting forests, air



and water bodies such as rivers, ponds etc. emphasis was also laid for plantation of trees and curbing indiscriminate use and disposal of plastics.

This was followed by a camp which was organized at Office headquarter. The camp was attended school children, general public, social activists etc. The resource person engaged by the organization addressed the audience and cautioned them about the harmful effects of air and water pollution and the need for conserving environment for the welfare of the present and future generations. The resource persons analyzed the various ways in which remedial and preventive steps could be taken by each member of the society and emphasis the role of every families to do whatever is possible for them. There was wide appreciation to the efforts of the organization in highlighting these issues.

### • **SAFE DRINKING WATER AND SANITATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME**

For the last many year the organization has also been devoting attention to the field of safe drinking water, Sanitation and hygiene activities. It is a fact that in rural areas, people generally pay least attention to conservation of water or the pollution caused to water or water bodies. Indiscriminate running of tube well is an abuse in the rural areas. People are prone to use contaminated water for drinking purpose regardless of the harm it might cause. The organization therefore has been launching awareness programmes for the benefit of people to prevent water pollution and conservation of ground water. Emphasis is also laid for rain water harvesting and the method of recharging ground water with the help of experts in this field.

As far as sanitation in rural areas is concerned the less said the better. People have been made aware of the negative aspects of open toilet practice widely prevalent in the rural areas. The organization has deputed its volunteers to various places in the rural areas who have advised to the people to switch over to low cost latrines which could be constructed with not much expense. Emphasis was also laid for keeping the common nalas and surroundings neat and clean to avoid outbreak and spread of communicable diseases.

### • **PROMOTION OF INDIAN CULTURE AND HERITAGE AND AWARENESS GENERATION THROUGH CULTURAL PROGRAMME**

Organizing cultural programmes was another aspects of the organization for propagating Indian culture and heritage. Many dances, musical programmes and plays were conducted on many occasions during the year under review. Special

Wherever the programmes were conducted, the response from the public was very encouraging as the social maladies were central themes of the plays and the message was easily sent home.

The cultural programmes are also focused to the burning problems such as perpetual poverty, illiteracy, malnutrition, lack of healthcare and hygiene, drug addiction, gender related issues, spread of dreaded diseases such as HIV/AIDS, cancer, etc and there are very few people who venture forward and seek solution to these problems. In this direction awareness generation through cultural activities are catching the attention of the targeted audience.

For the purpose of making the young people aware of the mental, social and economic questions being faced by the tobacco-borne diseases and tobacco-borne products, Shanti Ashram Inter College Saya and Gramodaya Ashram, PG College Saya along with Shanti Ashram Inter College Saya and Janta Janardan Inter. College students were organized by the institution in association with the school stop, in which 2000 youth were exposed to the ill effects of tobacco.

### • Covid-19 Awareness Programme

On March 24, a worker meeting was held to bring awareness about the symptoms and prevention of the Covid 19 epidemic and to make all the workers aware, everyone was provided with mask sanitizer Dettol hardware's and surgical gloves.
